Recreational and High Traffic Flooring

2. Product Description

BASIC USE

Recreational and High Traffic Flooring is suited for general play areas, multi-use areas, fitness, sports and recreation and other specialty high traffic and recreational applications.

A wide range of standard and custom colors is available. Special designs, including inlaid graphics, logos and patterns, are features of this flexible flooring system.

This system is especially well suited for use on playgrounds when used in conjunction with Poured-in-Place cushioned systems.

COMPOSITION & MATERIALS

Recreational and High Traffic Flooring is a single layer system consisting of recycled post-industrial EPDM (Ethylene Propylene Diene Monomer) rubber and polyurethane.

THICKNESS

Nominal 1/2" (12.7 mm), minimum 3/8" (9.5 mm), maximum 5/8" (15.9 mm)

COLORS

- 50% Blue 50% Black
- 50% Green 50% Black
- 50% Terracotta red 50% Black
- 50% Biege 50% Black
- Custom color combinations and graphics

LIMITATIONS

The following chemicals may cause damage to the playground surface and should be avoided: disinfectants, concentrated chlorine bleach, gasoline, diesel fuel, hydraulic and lubricating oils, acids and organic solvents.

In water play areas, pool surrounds and similar applications; dissolved minerals and other chemicals (hydrochlorides) may cause surface discoloration over time. This condition, should it occur, is not considered to be a product failure.

A yellowish shading of the top surface will be noticeable when using standard aromatic polyurethane binder to encapsulate some colors of EPDM granules. This is an industry wide design issue. An aliphatic binder, which does not produce this yellowish shading, is available at a somewhat higher cost. The specifier should seriously consider its use, especially with the following surface colors: blue, light gray, purple and pearl. For indoor applications where variable exposure to UV (ultraviolet) light occurs through windows, use of the aliphatic binder is recommended to ensure acceptable long-term aesthetic and visual consistency.

In indoor applications, there will be a noticeable odor present for a period of time after installation. The odor will gradually disappear in time. The time required for this to occur will depend upon air exchange rates and ventilation.

Variation in the flooring substrate, including cracks and surface irregularities, will be telegraphed through to the finish surface. Existing flooring materials should be prepared to ensure an acceptable finish.

The surface is porous. Drainage should be considered in applications where exposure to precipitation is expected. Consult Leadex Corporation, for more information on product limitations and recommended and excluded uses.

3. Technical Data

APPLICABLE STANDARDS

American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM)

Cracks should be patched with a cementitious patching compound. Substrate must be clean, dry and free of debris.

METHODS

Do not proceed with surfacing installation until all applicable site work, including substrate preparation, fencing, playground equipment installation and other relevant work, has been completed.

Verify that substrate conditions are suitable for installation of the surfacing system and do not proceed with installation until unsuitable conditions are corrected.

Surface Preparation:

Using a brush or short nap roller, apply primer to the substrate perimeter and any adjacent vertical barriers such as playground equipment support legs, curbs or slabs that will contact the surfacing system at the rate of 300 ft2/gal (8 m2/L). Installation: Using a hand trowel, install flooring surface at a consistent density of 58 pcf (929 kg/m3) to a nominal thickness of 1/2" (12.7 mm).

Allow flooring to cure for a minimum of 48 hours. At the end of the minimum curing period, verify that flooring is sufficiently dry and firm to allow foot traffic and use without damage to the surface. Do not allow foot traffic or use of the surface until it is sufficiently cured.

Complete installation recommendations are available from Leadex Corporation.

PRECAUTIONS

Protect the installed surface from damage resulting from subsequent construction activity on the site.

6. Warranty

The standard warranty period is 5 years from date of completion of work (2 years in water play areas, pool surrounds or similar applications). Contact Leadex Corporation, for more information on warranty terms.

7. Maintenance

For exterior applications: Hose off entire surface to remove food, drink, sand, dirt and loose debris. A pressure washer may be used, but do not exceed 1500 psl (10 MPa) pressure or place nozzle closer than 12" (305 mm) to surface. While surface is still damp, apply a mild household or commercial cleaner to a small area using a sprayer. Scrub using a medium bristle brush. Repeat as necessary on heavily stained areas. Once entire surface has been cleaned, rinse using a garden hose with spray nozzle attachment.

For interior applications: Vacuum and damp mop as appropriate. Moderate water application, depending on building construction. Complete maintenance recommendations are available from Leadex Corporation.

SCOPE OF WORK

Furnish all labor, materials, tools and equipment necessary to install, in place, all material as indicated on the plans and as specified herein.

QUALITY ASSURANCE

The Contractor shall employ only qualified, experienced supervisors and technicians skilled in the installation of this system.

The contractor shall also:

- 1. Have a proper license, in good standing, and never had a license revoked.
- 2. Not have had a Surety or Bonding Company finish work on any contract within the last five years.
- 3. Not have been disqualified or barred from performing work for any public Owner or other contracting entity.
- 4. Shall have demonstrable resources to fully service and warrant the systems installed. The contractor shall also provide proof in advance of its intent and ability to provide its Manufacturer's Warranty that guarantees the serviceability and playability of the artificial grass system for its intended uses for an eight (8) year period commencing with the date of Substantial Completion; some restrictions apply:
- 1. Must provide full coverage for eight (8) years from the date of Substantial Completion.
- 2. Must warrant that the materials installed meet or exceed the product specification.
- 3. Must have a provision to either make a cash refund or repair or replace such portions of the installed materials that are no longer serviceable within normal wear conditions.

PRODUCTS

The product shall be a tufted fabric coated with a polyurethane coating. The fibers shall be tufted into a triple layer of primary backing to a finished pile height of approximately 1.75" inches. The grass fabric shall be filled with 100% clean Envirofill coated sand.

Envirofill is 85% round in nature and coated with acrylic sealer to prevent dusting, water absorption, & mitigate bacterial growth. The elastomeric coating and backing materials shall be perforated to allow for rapid drainage.

A g-max & HIC impact pad comprised of closed cell polyethylene foam shall be installed over appropriately prepared base.

***Pad measurements 4' x 6' x 2 1/8"



Shock Attenuation (ASTM F-1292-4):	Not to exceed 200 G's & 1000 HIC upon installation

Turf Permeability:	20 inches water per hour
Backing Perforation Holes:	Every 2" x 4" x 1/4"

Infill material shall be Envirofill, coated sand granules, typically .50-1.50 mm in size. Envirofill shall be clean without and dust and sealed with an acrylic coating.

INSTALLATION

The installation shall be performed in full compliance with approved factory-trained technicians, skilled in the installation high-caliber artificial grass systems, working under the direct supervision of a principal of the company.

The surface to receive the artificial grass shall be inspected and certified as ready for the installation of the artificial grass system by the manufacturer or by a supervisor with a minimum of five years experience in the installation of such playground surfaces. The surface must also be perfectly clean as installation begins and shall be maintained in that condition throughout the process.

The artificial grass shall be loose laid across the field and attached to the perimeter edge detail. The artificial grass shall be of sufficient length to permit full cross-field installation. Turf to be laid in same direction to avoid reverse fall of grass fiber.

Seams shall be flat, tight, and permanent with no separation or fraying. Seams shall be glued using appropriate & tested glue & seam-tape system.

All seams around playground posts must be secure and create a "monolithic" appearance.

Infill materials shall be properly screened and bagged off site and applied in numerous thin lifts using special broad-casting equipment. The grass fabric shall be brushed or otherwise fibrillated prior to applying the Envirofill mix.

Impact Pad

All impact pads will be installed with minimal cuts, and should have a .25" spacing on all perimeter edges to allow for expansion and contraction. Pad should be installed in a staggered brick pattern and avoid long seam alignment

Filter fabric on impact pad shall be installed facing down, facing aggregate or prepared base: cement or asphalt acceptable.

1" Closed Cell pad yields a 4' Fall Height (4'x6' panels)

2 1/8" Closed Cell pad yields an 8' Fall Height (4'x6' panels)



After appropriate tests of the sub-grade, a geotextile membrane should be placed over the sub-grade to prevent infiltration of impervious or plastic materials. If installing the gmax & HIC impact pad, a pre-installed filter fabric is adhered to attenuation pad and is to be applied fabric side down. This will

prevent migration of sediment into synthetic grass system.

AGGREGATE LAYER

Existing soil conditions will determine the depth of the aggregate base. Typically, the base aggregate shall consist of a minimum of 3 inches of clean, crushed stone that has good angular facets.

In a typical installation, the aggregate shall be a minimum 3" compacted, stable, permeable, fractured stone. Care shall be taken to maintain the grade designed for the sub base. The aggregate shall be processed so as to be angular or fractured on all sides of the stone. The material must be shipped wet to the site to prevent undue segregation of the material.

The stone layer must be compacted to a minimum density of 95%. Material shall be a 100% fractured, by mechanical means. Material shall be devoid of mineral fines. All particles smaller than 1/4" shall be produced by manufactured means only. Rounded sands, semi-

angular river rock and soft aggregates are prohibited.

If creating a French drain or Dry-well system, recommended rock type as listed:

- a. A minimum of 2" clean, drainable crushed stone aggregate shall be placed in the bottom of the collector trenches, on top of the geotextile. The crushed should be compacted suitably.
- b. Place a minimum of 4" clean, crushed aggregate on the sides of the underdrain pipes and headers, and 6" minimum of the aggregate on top of the pipe network. Compact suitably.

Aggregate Base Layer:

1. Depending on existing soil conditions, spread approximately 3" to 4" of free-draining stone base aggregate over sub-grade in a uniform manner and compact. The sieve analysis of the open grade stone shall show a gradation as follows:

(% Of Passing): (Sieve Size)

100: 1.25" 52-100: 3/4" 36-65: 3/8" 8-40: #4 0-12: #16

0-5: #200

2. Finish grade shall be to tolerance of 1/4" in ten (10) feet and compact with 4-6 ton motorized roller



All cement or asphalt applications require site cleaning and prep as follow.

- 1. All loose debris to be swept and removed
- 2. Any cracks or open scars exceeding .25" to be filled and leveled
- 3. High point or lifts exceeding .25" should be ground to obtain equal planarity within existing site
- 4. Existing site should not have any major depression or potential static water pooling

5. Clean Up

The immediate construction field area and surrounding track or staging areas shall be kept clean as necessary throughout the entire construction process. After completion of all work, any debris created shall be promptly removed.

6. Unforeseen Obstructions

In the event that any unforeseen obstruction(s), whether naturally occurring or man-made, such as but not limited to rock, stone, underground water, unsuitable sub-grade soil, or utility pipes are encountered by the Contractor, the Owner shall be responsible for any and all costs for any extra labor and materials needed to complete the work. The Contractor shall immediately notify the Owner, Owner's

representative, or manufacturer's on-site representative of any obstruction discovered during the entire process.

OWNER RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Obtain all permits and variances.
- 2. Provide adequate access to work area. Ameriturf Systems Inc is not responsible for damage to the access area and does not perform re-grading, fine grading, sodding, patching of driveway asphalt/curb, seeding, or replanting.
- 3. Provide all site evaluation reports and testing as per Section II., above.
- 4. Provide initial topological survey for larger projects to determine quantities of excavation evaluative costing.


