The following steps should be taken to correct the violation:

Remedy: Must obtain permits and all required inspections or remove artificial turf.

The Code Enforcement Division will re-inspect the property on 10/24/2021 to determine if corrective measures have been completed. If corrective measures have not been completed by 10/24/2021, a Notice of Violation will be issued.

If this notice pertains to failure to maintain a historic structure, please be advised that:

- You may be subject to substantial fines that may not be mitigated.
- You may also be required to repair or restore the historic structure.
- If the historic structure is allowed to deteriorate to the point where it must be demolished:
 - the City Code requires that you replace the structure with a similar historically-appropriate structure; and
 - the property will no longer qualify for an historic preservation tax exemption.
