RESOLUTION NO. 2017-306

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE MAYOR AND CITY MANAGER'S DETERMINATION THAT THE DEBRIS RESULTING FROM HURRICANE IRMA IN THE COMMUNITIES OF JOURNEYS END AND TAHITI BEACH POSES AN IMMEDIATE THREAT TO THE PUBLIC SAFETY AND HEALTH OF RESIDENTS IN THOSE AREAS, AS WELL AS A THREAT TO REAL PROPERTY AND THAT REMOVAL OF THE DEBRIS IS IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE CITY.

WHEREAS, on October 8, 2017, an Emergency Order of the Mayor and City Manager of the City of Coral Gables, Florida Approving Debris Removal at Journeys End and Tahiti Beach ("Emergency Order") was issued; and

WHEREAS, the Emergency Order included a determination by the Mayor and City Manager that Hurricane Irma resulted in a significant amount of debris in Journeys End and Tahiti Beach which poses an immediate threat to the public safety and health of residents in those areas, as well as a threat to real property and that removal of the debris in those communities is in the best interest of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission also finds that the debris poses an immediate threat to the public safety and health of residents in those areas, as well as a threat to real property and that removal of the debris is in the best interest of the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CORAL GABLES:

SECTION 1. That the foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution upon the adoption hereof.




