KEY FACTS ON FOOD WASTE



- In the US, 30-40% of food supply is wasted- 133 billion pounds a year
- Food is the single largest category of material placed in municipal landfills- nearly 25% of landfill waste
- Average household: 2-3 pounds of edible food wasted per person weekly
- Accounts for 58% of landfill methane emissions
- If it were a country-US food waste would be the 3rd largest producer of carbon dioxide.



CORAL GABLES LIBRARY DROP-OFF LOCATION



- The City is partnering with the Miami-Dade County Library in Coral Gables
- Launch Date – April 20

- Over 7,700,000 pounds of organics diverted from landfills since 2020.
- Services include community, commercial and events/ wedding composting, waste audit & consultation services, and regenerative landscaping.

COMPOSTING PROGRAM



- Renüable will handle all collection
- Pick-Up will be twice a week- (2) 45-gallon toters
- Pilot program for the first year- \$6,000
- City has applied for two grants
- Renüable will provide city with 1 cubic yard of compost 2 times a year
- Educational workshops to teach correct composting habits

- Raw or cooked fruits or vegetables
- Raw or cooked Dairy products (eggs)
- BPI Certified products
- Dead Plants, Yard Clippings, and Leaves
- Paper and napkins
- Pizza Boxes
- Newspaper
- Grains such as bread, rice, and pasta

NOT ACCEPTED

- No Poop bags or animal waste
- Coal or Charcoal Ashes
- Oil or Grease
- Any Toxic Materials
- Glass
- Plastics
- Cans or Metals

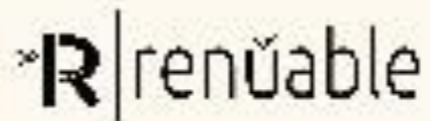
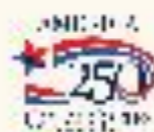

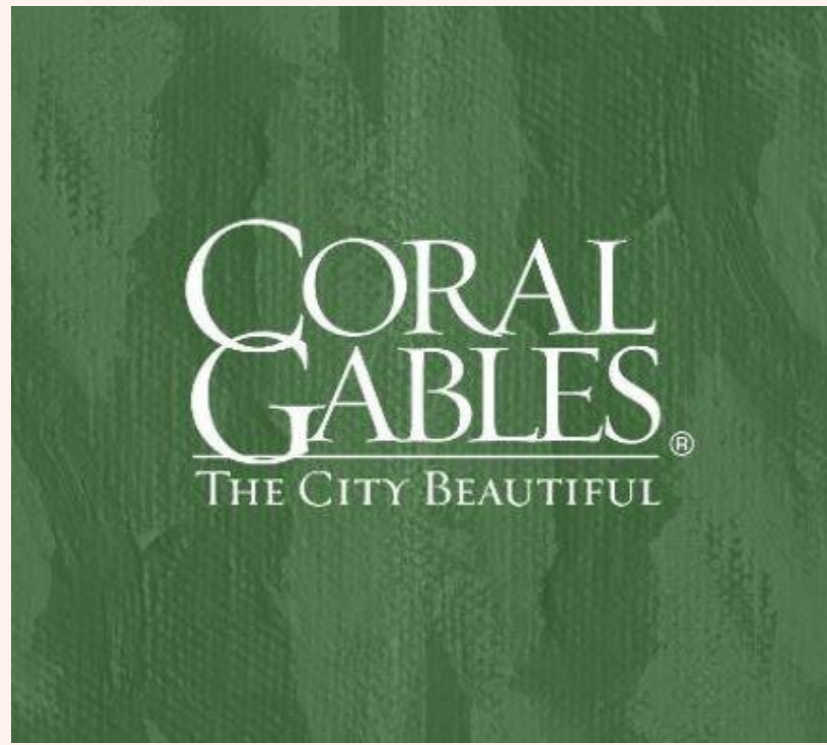
