

CITY OF CORAL GABLES, FLORIDA

A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF CORAL GABLES' HISTORIC PRESERVATION BOARD AND THE LANDMARKS ADVISORY BOARD REQUESTING THAT THE CITY WORK WITH ITS LOBBYING TEAM AND THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION TO ADDRESS CERTAIN ISSUES REGARDING STREETLIGHTS IN THE CITY

WHEREAS, the City's Historic Preservation Board and Landmarks Advisory Board have had various separate and joint meetings regarding streetlights throughout the City; and

WHEREAS, during the regularly scheduled joint meeting of the Landmarks Advisory Board and Historic Preservation Board held in November of 2024 the two boards again discussed the issue of lighting in the City; and

WHEREAS, discussion was had among the two boards regarding engaging the City's lobbying team to engage the Public Service Commission to evaluate adjusting the City's current rates to address the installation of streetlights replicating the existing silver streetlights that have been discussed by the boards extensively; and

WHEREAS, at the joint meeting the City's Landmarks Advisory Board adopted the same motion adopted by the Historic Preservation Board and the two boards jointly submit the following request to the City Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CORAL GABLES:

SECTION 1. That the foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution upon adoption hereof.

SECTION 2. That the Historic Preservation Board and Landmarks Advisory Board jointly request that the City Commission work with its lobbyists in Tallahassee to engage the Public Service Commission to undertake the process of adjusting the City's rate based to include the installation of streetlights replicating the existing silver streetlights in design, color, height and luminaire.

SECTION 3. That the Historic Preservation Board and Landmarks Advisory Board jointly request that the City work with and include members of the Historic Preservation

Board and the Landmarks Advisory Board in meetings with lobbyists, Florida Power & Light, and the Public Service Commission regarding the selection of streetlights, and that the City report the progress made on this issue to both boards on a regular basis.

SECTION 4. That this Resolution shall become effective upon the date of its passage and adoption herein.
