Our young musicians warmly invite you to their Advent Violin Recitals

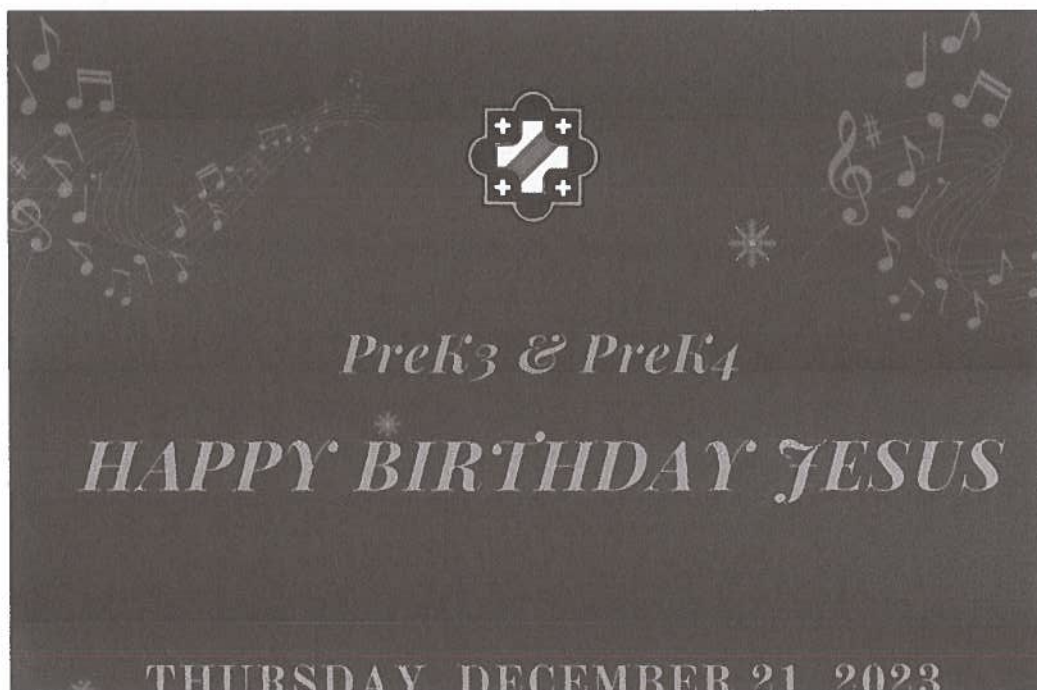

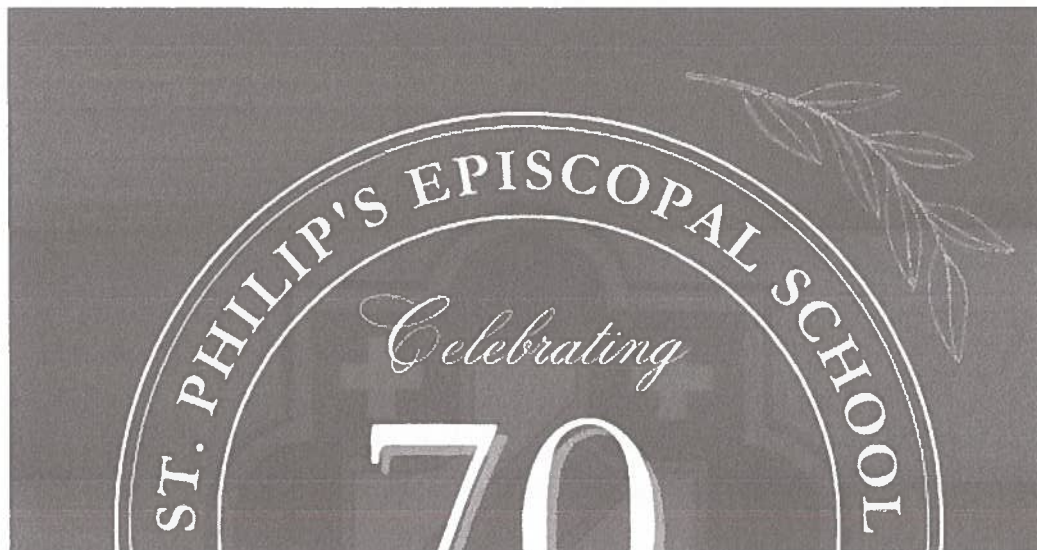


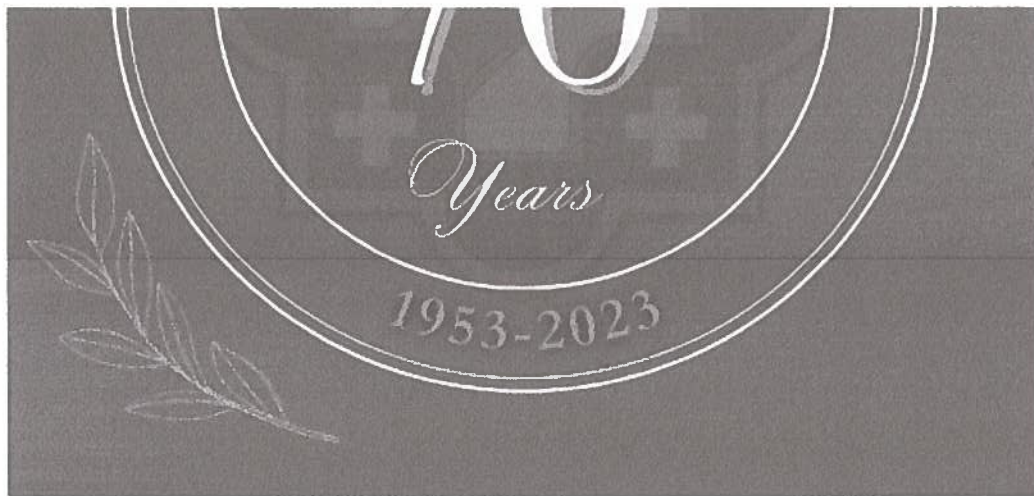
