CORAL GABLES HISTORY TOURS

Lead by Mary Snow (Appointed by Commissioner Quesada)

- Implemented pilot program (December) with fourth grade students from George Washington Carver Elementary School
 - Students and their chaperones toured the Coral Gables Museum, Coral Gables City Hall and the Biltmore Hotel
- "It takes a village":
 - Funded by the Coral Gables Community Foundation and MDCPS
 - Planned and lead by the Coral Gables Museum
 - Facilitated by MDCPS staff

- The permanent addition of the City's just reopened Merrick House as a stop in future tours
- Expand program to all 4th grade students at SCRC schools
- Sustain the program in perpetuity (endowment)

INTERNSHIP/MENTORSHIP COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAMS




- Established a relationship with MDCPS to accept academic year interns

- *Bigs in Blue* to be expanded to include *Bigs in Red*, a new national initiative involving fire departments being implemented by Big Brothers Big Sisters of Miami
 - The City of Coral Gables will be the only municipality in the country to administer both programs.
