**RESOLUTION NO. 2025-422**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION ACCEPTING THE POLICE DEPARTMENT'S 2024-2025 RED LIGHT CAMERA SURVEY RESPONSES AND WRITTEN SUMMARY AFTER A PUBLIC HEARING AND PRESENTATION AT THE OCTOBER 28, 2025 CITY COMMISSION MEETING IN ACCORDANCE WITH FLORIDA STATUTE § 316.0083(4).

**WHEREAS**, the City, as the operator of multiple traffic infraction detectors ("Red Light Cameras"), is required by F.S. § 316.0083(4) to submit an annual report ("Annual Report") to the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles ("DHSMV") detailing the results of using the Red Light Cameras and the procedures for enforcement; and

**WHEREAS**, in its 2024 Session, the Florida Legislature amended F.S. § 316.0083(4) to require that any municipality operating Red Light Cameras present its Annual Report at a meeting of its governing body along with a written summary, to be read aloud at the meeting, containing specific Red Light Camera program statistics; and

**WHEREAS**, during this meeting, interested members of the public must be allowed to comment on the Annual Report; and

**WHEREAS**, this Resolution and its attachments shall be transmitted to the DHSMV once heard and adopted by the Commission;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CORAL GABLES:**

**SECTION 1.** The foregoing "**WHEREAS**" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution upon adoption hereof.

**SECTION 2.** That the City's Annual Report (attached hereto as "Exhibit A") was included as a single reporting item on the agenda of the regular meeting of the City Commission on October 28, 2025.

**SECTION 3.** That interested members of the public were given an opportunity to comment on the Annual Report.


**SECTION 4.** That a written summary containing the information required by Fla. Stat. § 316.0083(4)(a)(2)(b) (attached hereto as "Exhibit B") was read aloud during the regular meeting of the City Commission on October 28, 2025.

**SECTION 5.** That this Resolution shall become effective upon the date of its passage and adoption herein.



In accordance with Section 316.0083(4), Florida Statutes, the following is the written summary of the Coral Gables Police Department's Red-Light Camera Program for 2024-2025 to be read aloud at the October 28, 2025 meeting of the City Commission. This summary will be transmitted to the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles along with the accompanying resolution of the City Commission.

Between July 1, 2024 and June 30, 2025, the City of Coral Gables issued Ten Thousand Three Hundred Thirteen (10,313) notices of violation. Forty-four (44) were contested, of which Twenty-five (25) were upheld, Fifteen (15) are pending final outcome, and Four (4) were dismissed. One thousand two hundred twenty-three (1,223) were issued as uniform traffic citations and one hundred nineteen (119) are pending issuance as uniform traffic citations. Six thousand seven hundred ninety-four (6,794) notices of violation were paid.

The City's Red-Light Camera Program collected a total of \$1,276,176.57, which was distributed as follows:

- Remitted to the State of Florida Dept. of Revenue - \$617,271.00
- Paid to RedSpeed - \$464,278.00
- Retained by the City - \$194,627.57
