## CITY OF CORAL GABLES, FLORIDA

A RESOLUTION OF THE CORAL GABLES PARKS AND RECREATION ADVISORY BOARD REQUESTING THAT THE CITY COMMISSION PURSUE A SEPARATE REFERENDUM FOR THE WAR MEMORIAL YOUTH CENTER MASTER PLAN

**WHEREAS,** at the March 10th, 2022 Coral Gables Parks and Recreation Advisory Board ("Board") meeting, the Board was presented with the Master Plan Referendum, previously presented to the City Commission; and

**WHEREAS**, the presentation showcased the top twenty recommended project priorities, that were selected based on public facilities, parks and open spaces nearing their end of life, safety, public need, and public desire; and

**WHEREAS**, the presentation highlighted potential funding sources and the millage impact for taxable assessed values of homes in Coral Gables; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board had discussions on the options of the project-based priority funding and believes that pursuing a separate referendum for the War Memorial Youth Center Master Plan will allow for a clearer view of future revenue sources;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PARKS AND RECREATION ADVISORY BOARD OF THE CITY OF CORAL GABLES:

**SECTION 1.** The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution upon adoption hereof.

**SECTION 2.** The Coral Gables Parks and Recreation Advisory Board urges the City Commission to pursue a separate referendum for the War Memorial Youth Center Master Plan.

**SECTION 3.** The Coral Gables Parks and Recreation Advisory Board urges the City Commission to pursue a recommendation of splitting the plans, given that the impact of future residential tax dollar increases is still unknown, to allow for a clearer view of future revenue sources for the potential need of a second referendum option.

**SECTION 4.** That this Resolution shall become effective upon the date of its passage and adoption herein.
