(b) It shall be unlawful for any person to do work on or cut into, dig up, or excavate for the purpose of laying sewers, water mains, underground wires, or gas pipes, or for setting poles, or any other purpose whatsoever, any of the streets, parks, parkways, sidewalks, alleys, or easements in the city without first securing from the director of public works a permit to do such work, and make such excavations.

No person shall commence or cause to be commenced any miscellaneous work, which does not otherwise require a building permit, which affects the structure, appearance, or architectural design of any structure, site or site improvements until an application for a zoning permit has been previously filed with the Development Services Department. No such miscellaneous work, which affects the structure, appearance or architectural design of any structure, site or site improvements shall commence until a permit has been issued by the City in every case where the city of each proposed work requires the issuance of such permit by the City in accordance with the provisions of the City's Zoning Ordinance.
