WHEREAS, the City Commission has determined that fees for various licenses, permits, and services are necessary to recover the City's cost of providing these services; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission has adopted a comprehensive updated Fee Schedule on June 9, 2015, as subsequently amended; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission desires to make changes to the Fee Schedule to update its various Local Business Taxes; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission desires to make changes to the Fee Schedule to update the Fire False Alarm fees;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CORAL GABLES:

SECTION 1. The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution upon adoption hereof.

SECTION 2. The City Commission revises the Fee Schedule as detailed in Exhibit I, with changes indicated

If any section, sentence, clause of phrase of this Resolution is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution.

## SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Resolution shall become effective shall November 1, 2017 with the exception of item numbers 1900 - Art Gallery; and 21801 - Restaurant/Delicatessen, TakeOut which shall be retroactively effective to October 1, 2017.
