ITEM TITLE:

Resolution authorizing temporary placement of five (5) 3' X 3 ½' banners at certain City facilities from October 23 through October 31, 2009, in recognition of "Red Ribbon Campaign week in the City of Coral Gables"

RECOMMENDATION OF THE CITY MANAGER:

Approval.

BRIEF HISTORY:

The Red Ribbon week is a way for communities to take a visible stand against drugs through the symbol of the Red Ribbon.

The Red Ribbon Campaign was started when drug traffickers murdered Kiki Camarena, a DEA agent, in Mexico City in 1985. This began a tradition of displaying red ribbons as a symbol of intolerance towards the use of drugs.

This request is to temporarily display a 3 X 3 ½ banner at the following locations in recognition of this important event:

- Coral Gables Youth Center
- Central Police and Fire Station
- Fire Station No. 2
- Fire Station No. 3
- Maintenance and Storage Facility

In addition, during this time, "Red Ribbon" car magnets will be displayed on City vehicles, and Police Youth Resources will be participating in school events.
