




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Development Project Overview with Site plan

Project Overview:

719 Biltmore Way Residences is a luxury residential development located on a prestigious and historic Biltmore Way Street in Coral Gables, Florida.

This exclusive project comprises nine full-floor, four-bedroom residences, each exceeding 3,500 square feet, within a 12-story boutique building.

Building Specifications:


- Structure: 12-story reinforced concrete construction with impact-resistant windows and sliding glass doors.
- **Residences:** Nine full-floor units, each with a private elevator foyer and dual elevators.
- Ceiling Height: 10' ceilings throughout.
- Parking: Gated, covered self-parking with two spaces per residence, with an option for a third vehicle lift.




Artist Information

Alberto Cavalieri, born in Caracas in 1969, is a renowned Venezuelan visual artist specializing in monumental sculptures and architectural interventions. He completed his studies in industrial design, mechanical engineering, and fine arts, focusing on sculpture since 1994. Cavalieri's work is celebrated for its paradoxical exploration of form and matter, using materials like metal to create sinuous, organic shapes that seem to defy the rigidity of their composition.

Cavalieri's sculptures often feature complex knots and swirling forms, symbolizing various human activities and emotions. His approach combines high-tech processes with traditional steelwork techniques, allowing him to challenge physical laws and create visually striking pieces that appear to levitate and move organically.

His notable exhibitions include solo shows such as "Fragmented Knot" at Galería Art Nouveau in Florida and "Iron and Epiphanies" at Galería Freites in Caracas. His work is featured in numerous public and private collections, including the Museum of Latin American Art in California and the Museum of Contemporary Art in Caracas (Evan Lurie Gallery) (Marión Art Gallery) (Eternity Gallery) (OMSA Gallery).



longevity and minimal maintenance.









Proposed Maintenance

Galvanized steel is a low maintenance material, however to maintain its appearance we recommend cleaning it one or two times a year.

Galvanized steel is designed to be corrosion-resistant, recommended maintenance will help extend the life of the art piece and keep it looking its best.

City permits, foundation, landscaping and lighting expenses are the responsibility of the buyer.

Art in Public Places Fee

- 1% of the Project's total Art in Public Places estimate fee.
- The cost of the proposed art piece: \$220,000 for artwork + additional \$ for packing, shipping, permits, installation, foundation, electrical work, insurance, and all other related expenses.
- Funds toward the artwork should not replace expenses toward lighting requirements.
- The artwork and all related expenses will be the responsibility of the Developer, with any difference in cost to be paid into the Art Fund.

Maintenance

- Developer is required to provide for the perpetual maintenance of the artwork in accordance with the City of Coral Gables Art in Public Places Funding, Goals, and Implementation Guidelines, which will be memorialized in a covenant to run with the land.
- Coordination of maintenance will be the responsibility of the Developer and is not related to the Art in Public Places Fee.
