**ITEM TITLE:**

A Resolution of the City Commission of the City of Coral Gables, Florida, authorizing the temporary installation of two painted Jaguar Parade® sculptures, as part of the original 11-piece collection, on Miracle Mile in collaboration with Jaguar Parade®, and Artery; authorizing the City Manager or designee to execute any necessary agreements, permits, and related documents for the installation, maintenance, and removal; authorizing a temporary encroachment into the public right-of-way; and providing for an effective date.

**BRIEF HISTORY:**

Jaguar Parade® is an internationally recognized conservation and cultural initiative that raises awareness and funds for jaguar preservation and environmental sustainability through the exhibition of artist-designed jaguar sculptures displayed in prominent public spaces around the world. The Jaguar Parade® Miami 2026 exhibition includes a curated collection of 11 sculptures that have previously appeared in internationally recognized locations including Times Square, Central Park, the United Nations General Assembly, the World Trade Center, Copacabana Beach, Christ the Redeemer, Sugarloaf Mountain, and Paris during the 2024 Olympic Games.

The proposed temporary installation consists of two painted fiberglass jaguar sculptures to be displayed along Miracle Mile as a cultural and placemaking activation intended to increase pedestrian activity, promote tourism and economic development, generate social media engagement, and further position Coral Gables as a vibrant cultural destination. The proposed installation locations are intended to maximize pedestrian visibility and visitor engagement while maintaining accessibility and compliance with applicable City standards.

The exhibition period is anticipated to run from approximately June 10, 2026 through July 20, 2026. All transportation, shipping, installation, maintenance, insurance, security coordination, and removal activities associated with the temporary installations will be coordinated and funded by Artery at no cost to the City.

The temporary installations will remain subject to all applicable City permitting, structural, safety, accessibility, and Public Works requirements and may be removed or relocated at the direction of the City as necessary. The proposed encroachment within the public right-of-way is intended to support cultural programming, community engagement, sustainability awareness, tourism activity, and economic development opportunities within the City Beautiful.

**Fiscal Impact:** No direct cost to the City. Transportation, shipping, installation, maintenance, insurance, security coordination, and removal of the temporary installations will be coordinated and funded by Artery.
