are in violation of the following sections and subject to Section 101-107 of the City Code of the City of Coral Gables by:

City Code - Chapter 105. Minimum Housing.

This case has been migrated to Energov for completion. See Energov Case # NOVI-05-02-0418. Property roof is in disrepair, covered with three blue traps and dirty. Soflits, planters, front entry & walkway and sidewalks are dirty.

The following steps should be taken to correct the violation:

Remedy: Must remove blue trap but also clean and repair roof. Must clean and/or paint soffits, planters, front entry & walkway and sidewalks are dirty.

As a result of the above violation(s), a complaint has been filed against you and you are hereby commanded to appear before the Code Enforcement Board for a hearing on 9/21/2022 at 8:30 am in the Commission Chambers, located on the second floor of:

This is your notice to appear at said time and place. Failure to do so will result in the matter being heard in absentia. An administrative fee of \$108.75 will be assessed at the time of your hearing.

Please be advised that if someone will be attending the hearing on your behalf, he or she must provide a power of attorney from you at the time of the hearing.

If this notice pertains to failure to maintain a historic structure, please be advised that:

- You may be subject to substantial fines that may not be mitigated.
- You may also be required to repair or restore the historic structure.
- If the historic structure is allowed to deteriorate to the point where it must be demolished:
 - the City Code requires that you replace the structure with a similar historicallyappropriate structure; and
 - the property will no longer qualify for an historic preservation tax exemption.
