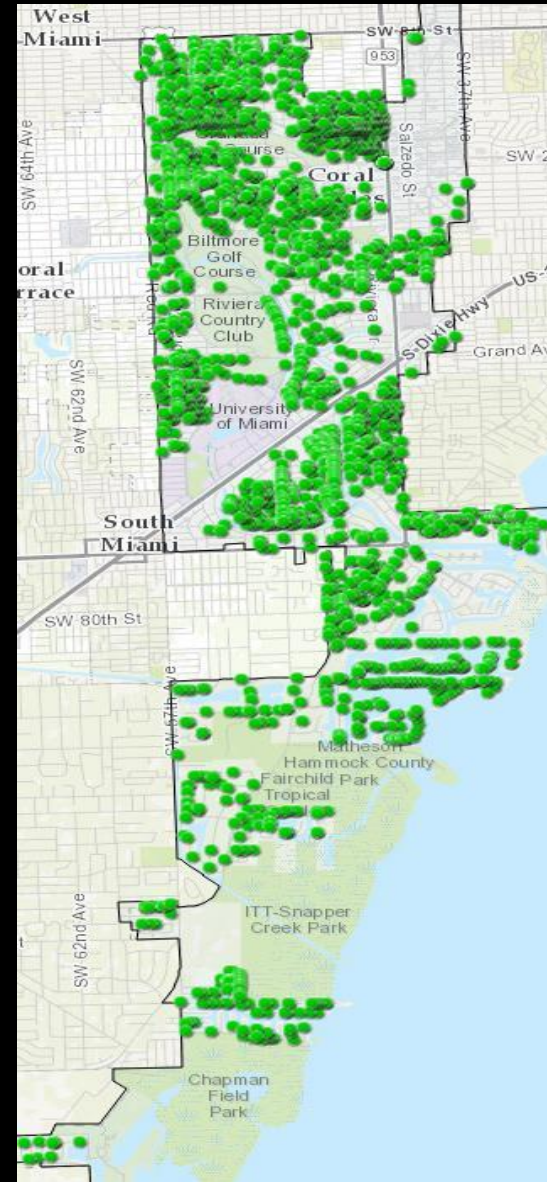

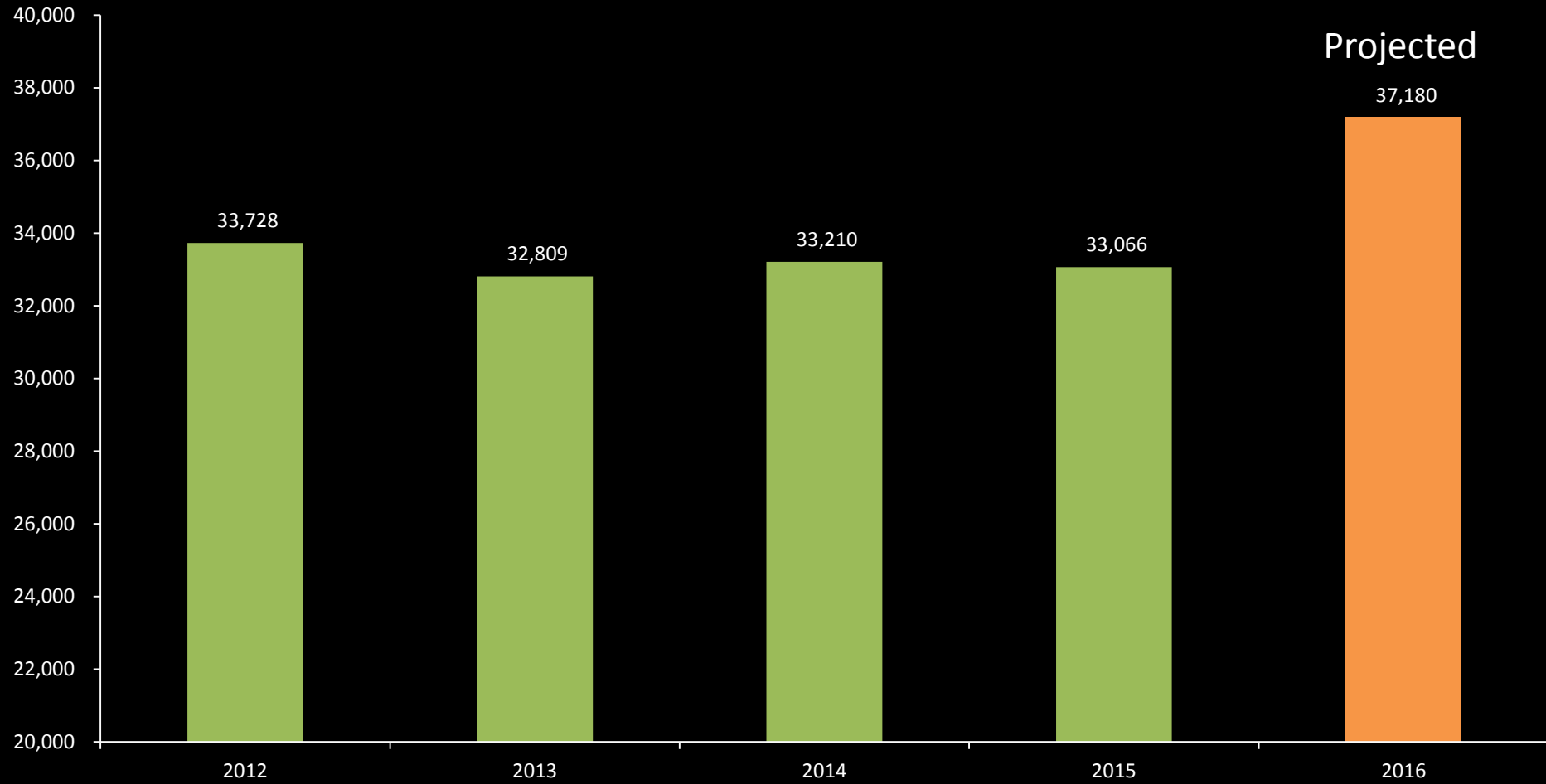

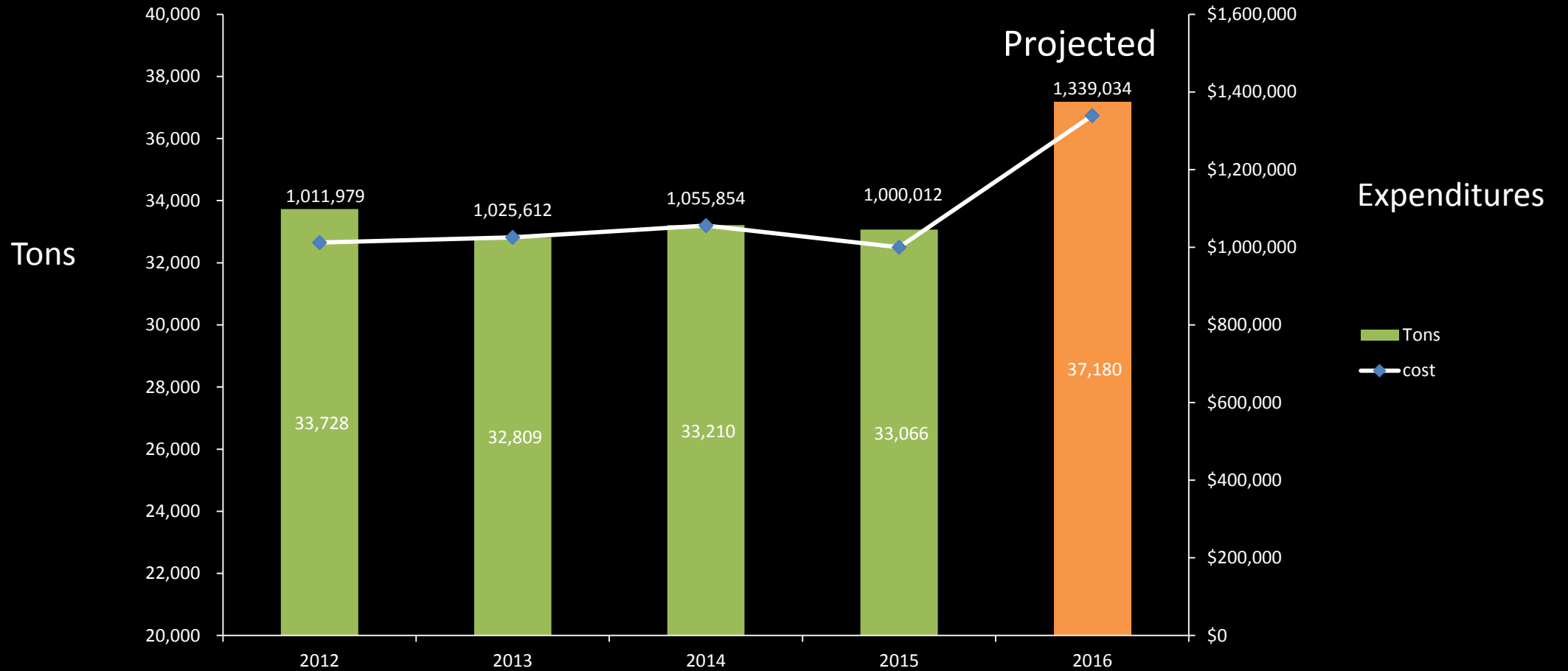
Trash Pit Locations

Miami	Weekly	1 cubic yard (approx.)	Yes	Yes (for large tree trimming)
Miami-Dade County (including 8 municipalities)	Twice a Year	25 cubic yards	No	Yes *
Fort Lauderdale	Monthly	10 cubic yards	Yes	No
Key Biscayne	Monthly	Limited –maximum 300 lbs. no large piles	Yes	No
Coral Springs (P)	Weekly	6 cubic yards	Yes	Yes
South Miami	Weekly	12.5 cubic yards	Yes	No
Hollywood	Weekly	4 cubic yards	Yes	Yes

Solution



Minimum Goal:

- Trash Piles for less than 48-72 hours.
- Fewer and smaller trash pits.

Maximum Goal:

- No Trash Piles
- No Trash Pits

- September, 2016: Community Meetings
- November, 2016: Commission initiates process to establish trash service goals and objectives
- January – April, 2017: Develop revenue & expenditure projections for 2018 budget process

Potential Ordinance Amendments

- Require landscape companies to register with the city and to have visible evidence of registration in company vehicles
- Prohibit the placement of household waste or recyclables in the trash pits
- Prohibit the placement of yard waste cut by landscape companies on parkway swales
- Require placement of yard waste by residents no sooner than 24 hours prior to the scheduled collection day
