

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**B**rick, concrete, mahogany, and marble were used in the construction of this two-story waterfront home. Surrounded by subtropical foliage, the house sits seemingly alone on a point of land. A long, gravel drive approaches the house, winding past island planting areas.

The house was built around the pool and patio areas. Sliding glass doors open onto the covered patio off the living room and library. Built-in lighting and a large roof skylight reduce the need for supplementary floor and table lamps. The poolside terrace next to the house is open to the sun. A walkway leads to a higher terrace on the other side of the pool and to a cabana and guesthouse. At night, colored lights play on the sparkling waters of the fountain.
