The proposal from the large Barreto Hospitality Group is similar to that by large developer Allan Morris for the inappropriate Ponce Park Tower proposal across from the disproportionate Plaza project that is currently under construction. These proposals are being presented and that construction is being conducted without critical analysis such as comprehensive crime or traffic studies to allow forecasting and planning for their impact on residential life.

The current discussion regarding Burger Bob's is emblematic of the ongoing discontent with overdevelopment in Coral Gables and adds to the call for a referendum. The residents of Coral Gables are encouraged by the referendum carried out by residents of the Village of Bal Harbour in January 2021, setting the precedent for success in preserving the character, scale, and life of our quiet neighborhoods.
