ITEM TITLE:

Ordinance on Second Reading: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CORAL GABLES, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 74 -TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES, ARTICLE IV- BICYCLES, SKATEBOARDS, SCOOTERS, SHARED MOBILITY DEVICES, AND OTHER SIMILAR DEVICES OF THE CITY OF CORAL GABLES CODE TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL DEFINITIONS, REQUIREMENTS FOR OPERATION OF SHARED MOBILITY DEVICES PROGRAMS, AND ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS REGARDING OPERATION OF SHARED MOBILITY DEVICES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, REPEALER, CODIFICATION, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BRIEF HISTORY:

Since the summer of 2018 the City has had two operators operating a pilot program for shared mobility devices, specifically motorized scooters, within the City. The City Commission required, in Ordinance 2018-23, that any operator operating a shared mobility device program in the City have a valid Memorandum of Understanding with the City in order to operate within the City. This proposed Ordinance codifies many of the requirements that the City has in its Memorandum of Understanding with the two current operators, and amends the City Code to add additional requirements for and prohibitions regarding the operation of shared mobility device programs in the City.

This Ordinance was passed on first reading on February 26, 2019. The following changes were made between first and second reading:

- Changed the time and Operator has to comply with relocation requests from two (2) to three (3) hours;
- Added “a waiver of subrogation in favor of the City of Coral Gables” to all insurance requirements;
- Added requirement that any scooter staged in the same location, without being operated, for more than forty-eight (48) hours shall be relocated by the Operator;
- Changed the language regarding the payment of \$1/device/day from “must” to “may”;
- Added the word “designated” to the definition of “deploy”;
- Added the word “designated” to the definition of “rebalancing”; and
- Removed “without the application of human power” related to maximum speeds from the definition of “motorized scooter.”
