I watched attentively the Mobility Hub Sunshine Meeting held last Thursday. Please don't let usual minority of discontented residents sway your decision on the architecture of the mobility hub or the concept of the project. I'm elated that it finally appears that Coral Gables is moving towards the 21st century. I completely agree with Venny Torre's comments that historic building in juxtaposition to modern buildings exist successfully throughout the country with buildings that are much older and with greater historic significance. In this case the juxtaposition is not even an abutting one, as the 1950s vintage low slung commercial buildings that would be the hub's neighbors are truly unremarkable in any historical context. The juxtaposition is one with the excessive Mediterranean architecture throughout the city, some of which is good. In most cases, though it is poorly executed with many examples present. Adding arches, featuring arcades, and sticking Mediterranean elements on a building's exterior does not make it Mediterranean. Moreover, It does not necessarily render quality architecture. We need to move forward and become current to foster sustainable architecture and have the City continue to thrive in the coming years.

I heard of the online the petition signed by 900 residents. Online petitions are not serious. They are impossible to validate and at times are even irrelevant to the true context of the issue under petition. A petition showing the project in proper context would certainly garner support from a significant portion of the constituency. Unfortunately, it is a small number of vocal discontents that speak louder than the rest of our community. Please don't accept this as the voice of the community.

Mediterranean architecture is not meant to be executed on a parking garage. We already have examples in the city. They are failed hackneyed architectural expressions of the Mediterranean concept. Please don't repeat these mistakes again.

Revised Estimated Financials

Coral Gables has increased the parking rates for G1 and G4 by \$.50 per hour in Y2021.

Gross revenue improvement = approx. \$450,000

It has been reported that the Genslar has been paid \$2,000,000 for the architectural plans for the Parking Garage, which increases the overall cost to \$44,000,000.

A cost of capital must be assigned to the total costs.

Based on known estimated projections from Coral Gables:

Building Cost	\$44,000,000
Y2022 Gross Revenues	\$ 1,800,000
NOI	\$ 1,037,000
Debt Service	\$ 2,226,072
P / (L) for 1 st Year	(\$1,189,072)

The financial review of the parking structure should be conducted as a stand-alone business opportunity and not the beneficiary of the transferring of funds from other entities or projects to financially justify the new building.

Coral Gables should not "Rob Peter to pay Paul".

The estimated rule of thumb for this project:

Every increase of Gross Revenue of \$450,000

produces Net Revenue of \$300,000 ..

Based on the CG's current timing of \$0.50 rate increase every 4 years:

Breakeven occurs in approx. years 16 - 20.

Overall project profitability occurs in roughly year 30+.

Nobody builds anything with 30 years payback.

Any recession, pandemic or other catastrophic event would cause a deterioration in the profitability.

Mr. Torre is correct.

Parking garages should be money machines (not a quote).

To make this project financially reasonable without burdening the residents of Coral Gables,

Coral Gables needs to either:

- A...Increase revenue
- B...Decrease expenses
