An Ordinance amending Chapter 46 of the Code of the City of Coral Gables, entitled “Pensions,” amending Section 46-253 entitled “Normal Retirement Income,” to provide the same alternative dispute resolution mechanism to resolve disputes about future cost of living increases to current and former City employees who retired, entered the DROP or reached eligibility for normal retirement after January 1, 2013, but before the February 2015 Retirement Plan Amendment, as is provided to members of the Certified Class in the Murrhee v. City of Coral Gables case and providing for a repealer provision, severability clause, codification and providing for an effective date.

Mayor Valdes-Fauli: F-3.

City Attorney Ramos: F-3 is on Second Reading as well. It’s an Ordinance amending Chapter 46 of the Code of the City of Coral Gables, entitled “Pensions,” amending Section 46-253 entitled “Normal Retirement Income,” to provide the same alternative dispute resolution mechanism to resolve disputes about future cost of living increases to current and former City employees who

retired, entered the DROP or reached eligibility for normal retirement after January 1, 2013, but before the February 2015 Retirement Plan Amendment, as is provided to members of the Certified Class in the Murrhee v. City of Coral Gables case and providing for a repealer provision, severability clause, codification and providing for an effective date. There have been no changes between First and Second except the effective date. Teamsters have returned a Memorandum of Understanding that it amends the Collective Bargaining Agreement. We are pending on police and fire; each will have an effective date depending on when we receive the fully executed MOU from each of the three unions. It is a public hearing item.
