Thank you for your input on the application for a zoning change requested by the new tenant under a lease with the City to operate the building known as "The Country Club of Coral Gables". While zoning applications are considered quasi-judicial and, I have been advised by the city attorney that all communications should be held on the record so to prevent any allegations of undue prejudice, I have always responded in detail to all e-mails from my fellow citizens, regardless of the nature of the issue before the city commission. Furthermore, I have always placed those communications in the public record. Notwithstanding my responses to residents, I always maintain an open mind and consider the evidence and testimony presented at the public hearing, without undue consideration to any communication which I may have received. However, I have been advised that I should not offer my opinions on this matter until after the Commission's final vote. I have, however, cast a consistent ballot on this proposal at three separate hearings. While I will abide by the request not to discuss the matter privately, the following is a factual description of the events thus far. This application has been heard at public hearing by the city commission three times and is scheduled for final public hearing on December 15, 2009. The public comment portion of the proceedings have concluded and the city commission will be discussing the final aspects of the remaining issue for consideration, which is a request for approval for outdoor seating on what is now the North Greenway Drive front lawn of this historic property. The city commission has already considered and approved an amended site plan providing for landscaping, porte a cochere, additional exterior architectural features, valet operations and employee parking, to name a few. After review of the evidence submitted and consideration of the testimony, I voted with the majority on these issues. However, as to the final and remaining issue, I have been and continue to be concerned about the potential impacts of outdoor seating in residential areas. I have maintained an open mind and am prepared to listen to the pros and cons of this request at the final public hearing, as we discuss the matter amongst the city commissioners. As I have previously stated on the record, this is not a debate over the pros and cons of "outside dining" – there are outside dining areas at the club site which are approved and allowed within the current zoning – this is a site specific issue. As I have already stated on the record, the larger issue is whether the Commission should amend the zoning code to allow a commercial use in front of a building next to a sidewalk within a residential neighborhood. There may be future implications for other neighborhoods. To better understand the issue you may watch the taped broadcasts on Channel 77 or you may request DVD's of the meetings from Gables TV. I look forward to speaking more freely with you upon the final outcome of this matter.

Dear Mayor & Commissioner of Coral Gables,

After carefully listening to the arguments presented against Mr. DiDonato's proposal for outdoor seating at the Coral Gables Country Club, it would appear that the objections to the outdoor seating is a red herring and that the real objection is to revitalizing the Country Club and all the increased traffic it would bring to the neighborhood. This is a valid objection and should be discussed and debated openly – not hidden behind the irrelevant issue of a few outdoor tables. The City needs to decide whether it wants a busy, successful and profitable Country Club to operate in a residential neighborhood. If the answer is yes – then Mr. DiDonato should be given the powers to operate it successfully. If the answer is no, then the building should be rezoned as a museum, or knocked down and made into a park for example. The third alternative is to send Mr. DiDonato back to Toronto and to leave the Club as an expensive and abandoned eyesore. If we do so, however, it is unlikely that any other developer will wish to follow in Mr. DiDonato's footsteps.

What most of the community wants is a place where we can walk to, to meet friends, relax, and have a quiet coffee or lunch. To compare this proposed small café to The Globe which offers music, a South Beach ambience and central location is entirely disingenuous. I'm sure Mr. DiDonato does not want to risk losing the café during or after the 18 month trial period for the café. My guess is that he'll do whatever it takes to stay under the radar and be a good neighbor. Certainly, the quality of life will not be negatively affected by the addition of a few outdoor tables, especially since the closest house in view of the café is .2 miles away.

If the City does indeed want the Country Club to be successful, then there are two very compelling arguments in favor of the "neighborhood" café and outdoor seating. Without the full-time staff needed to operate the café and restaurant, the Club would only be able to offer service for major functions like weddings and reunions. The local residences again would be shut out and the club would mostly likely return to its mausoleum status. Secondly, without the visual welcome of outdoor seating to invite passing residents into the club, people would not realize that the Club was open to the public and it would remain the closed and exclusionary façade that it has always been.

It was very clear from the meeting on November 3rd that the vast majority of Gables residents, taxpayers and voters are strongly in favor of Mr. DiDonato's proposals. It was equally clear that the small but vocal opposition was limited to the residents of North Greenway. When my friends and I voted for you Mr. Mayor, and voted for your fellow Commissioners, we voted for you to represent the citizens of the City of Coral Gables. We did not vote you to be mayor of North Greenway Drive. Please do what is right and help create a sense of community that will make us all proud.

Dear City Commissioners,

I attended the meeting at the Coral Gables Country Club the other evening and understand that a decision on the issue of outdoor seating will be made on November 17th. I am strongly in favor of this for the following reasons:

- The Country Club is currently empty and will deteriorate if this continues quite apart from the financial drain this imposes on the City and therefore on residents who pay taxes (there are much better projects to spend our money on). If the Liberty Entertainment Group takes over I think the Club will actually become an asset rather than a drain and enhance the value of the surrounding property.
- I spoke to two of the neighbors on Granada who live directly in front on the club closest to the proposed outdoor seating area and yet they are both in favor of it. Given that Mr. Di Donato has offered an 18 month trial period for the café it would seem that we have absolutely nothing to lose by trying.
- Traffic (both pedestrian and automotive) on North and South Greenway is already heavier than on surrounding streets because those streets surround a public golf course. Anyone who bought there knew that already but bought anyway. They could have chosen to buy on a dead end street or a much quieter back street but did not. Regardless, I do not believe that outdoor seating at the club will substantially increase traffic at all. Most of the neighbors are looking forward to walking or biking over there and there is plenty of parking in the back for those who choose to drive. Regarding increased danger that traffic might cause to pedestrians. I think this is a non-issue. The danger to pedestrians, roller bladers, cyclists, etc. comes from the fact that there is no pathway or bike path on the perimeter of the golf course so people are forced onto the street.
- Most importantly, the outdoor café and seating will enable Country Club to become a part of the community rather than yet another expensive, elitist club. I have lived fairly close by on Sorolla Avenue for 13 years and yet this was only the second time I had ever set foot in it. I look forward to being able to walk over and meet my neighbors many of whom were at the meeting. Currently the only way to do this is to walk around the golf course (or come to a meeting).

I thank you for taking the time to read my email and hope that you will endorse the outdoor seating on November 17th.

Dear Sirs

We used to live on South Greenway Drive and I know all too well that there can be no expectation of privacy if you chose to live on the Greenways. Joggers, roller-bladders and cyclists pass throughout the day, golfers comb through your front yard looking for balls, and strollers stop, facing your front door to chat with their friends and neighbors. We had a balcony from our bedroom overlooking the golf-course. The perfect place, we thought for morning coffee and the paper. No – too public. That is simply the price that you pay for living on the Greenway. It was like that 20 years ago when we lived there and I'm sure it is much worse now. (There were no cell phones

when I lived there).

None of this will change, whether you have outdoor seating or not.

Whenever there has been a big event at the Country Club – or a big tournament at the Golf Club, there are overflow cars along North Greenway Drive adjacent to the Club. This has always been the case. Anybody who chooses to purchase a house close to the Country Club should and would already be aware of this – that's how it has been since the Club was built.

None of this will change, whether you have outdoor seating or not. People who come to big private events at the Country Club will probably arrive by car, they come from all over and will need to drive.

This has always been the case – it's a fact of modern life. But most of the people using the café will probably have walked there – that's the whole appeal of the café. The existence of the café, indoor or outdoor, will have a negligible effect on motor traffic. My wife and I have lived here for 25 years and last night was the first time my wife had been inside the Country Club – a 3 minute walk from our house. Last night I heard many of my neighbors say the same thing – first visit. I was only familiar with the club because I used to attend monthly breakfast meetings for a business club that I belonged to; all the other members lived in Hollywood or Kendall – I was the only Gables member. The Club has never been part of the community and we are all delighted that you are finally going to change all that. You have tremendous local support behind you.

This will be the background for my comments to the Commission on November 17

I begin pushing for a parking plan last March. Through indifference and general failure none has been provided by the city or the operator. Therefore, I must make some default beliefs so that we can continue to make decisions about outdoor chairs in the Front lawn

Default movement at the front of the club will consist of nine (9) venues .

Four (4) will be for cars moving east-west and west-east

One (1) will be for non-directional walkers

There will be three (3) ant trails of individuals moving North-South and South-North traveling on paths of least resistance.

There will be one semi-stationary venue of individuals in a queue at the Front door awaiting access to the building.

Four (4) will be cars moving east-west and west -east

The Northern most column will be valet controlled cars moving East to West

The adjoining column will be citizen driven drop-off cars moving East to West

The third column of cars will be citizen driven drop -off cars moving West to East

The Southernmost column will local traffic unrelated to Club and will be moving East-to West and West to East

One (1) will be for non-direction walkers

Local non club related walkers, runners , dogs, baby carriages, will be traveling in all directions in the street and on the sidewalk

There will be three (3) ant trails of individuals moving north-south and South-North traveling on paths of least resistance

The western -most ant trail will be customers departing from the West side of Granada, angling across Granada and angling across North

Greenway to reach the sidewalk on the west side of the Club.

The central ant trail of individuals will move from the East side of Granada to the sidewalk on the south side of the club while weaving

Through Cars on North Greenway

The eastern-most ant trail will be customers departing from the Coco nut Trees angling across Greenway, weaving through cars on

North Greenway to reach the sidewalk on the south side of the Club.

There will be one semi-stationary venue of individuals in a queue at the front door awaiting access to the building

All of the customers in the previously described venues will be gathering at the door to gain access. As the Club has expressed

A desire to encourage tobacco users, this outdoor waiting area could--but may not--include a lot of cigars, dippers and chewers

The above is technical details that no one but no one has ever mentioned at any meeting or correspondence seen by myself

The worst of all is that the above IS NOT DEPICTED IN ILLUSTRATIONS MADE AVAILABLE to the Commission and the citizenry.

I believe that any one encouraging the installation of the chairs should acknowledge they are aware of all of the above

Activity, believe it is insignificant, and the chairs together with all of this activity should be accepted by the local population

Or

I believe that any one encouraging the installation of the chairs denies the activity described above exist and believe the chairs should be accepted by the local populations,

There will be some that will think the activity described above is adequate and the 80 chairs, will be excess

My take on the November 3 meeting at the country club.

Total success in all areas except for discussion of why the meeting was called.

On the success side.

Yes Chip the crowd immediately learned to consume the free wine provided by the host--will not need a six months trial period to determine if the crowd will drink.

Attendance was at the 160 person level I believe. The main group of party crashers were the former club members. As the liquor provider Mr. DiDanoto was entitled to show his power point and express his plans for the Club as well as what a disappointment it will be if we do not grant the Greenway side of outside dining.. That happened and was tastefully provided -- no incidents. The ex club members provided a lot of cheering and hand clapping for any comments about getting the café open..

Mr. Riel used a few minutes to provide what had happened to date with the negotiations with Mr. DiDanoto. He chose to not mention that (A) the city had granted 160 outside chairs on the West Side. He chose to not mention that (B) the City had granted a Valet Station on North Greenway right at the Front Door. The crowd got the concept that the city may want to cut back the outdoor dining from 80 to zero not possibly reduce the outdoor dining from 240 chairs to 160 chairs.

The final power point display was a replica of the Front door and the proposed outside chairs. This display was on display for most of the meeting but it did not include North Greenway Avenue which is the source of most of the controversy over crowding near the front entrance. I brought some display cards with my own drawings of the street in black and white but it was too dark to display them.

On the failure side

After his initial presentation, Mr. Riel turned the meeting over to various audience speakers that chose their own topics to discuss

Mr. Riel made no attempt to keep the speakers on point and to address the problem at hand—Chairs and customers on the front lawn and in the street

We did learn what the Club dues were in 1938, what an old retired policeman thought about security in the area, who lived in the area and not on Greenway drive, who had traveled to Europe, and of course who wanted to eat and drink at the club. among other trivia.

At least 6 speakers, thought they had a great idea that no one had thought of before—place outdoor dining chairs on the Westside of the Club. --- After each one of these great pronouncements, Mr Eric Riel did not let them know that such an idea had already been approved by the City and Mr. DiDanoto wanted the 80 chairs in addition to these 160 Chairs on the West side.

The speakers who were opposed to the 80 chairs, all just stated they opposed the move. None referenced the fact that the Valet parking cars line, and the drop-off car line, the walk in crowd coming from the West side of Granada, the walk in crowd coming from the east side of Granada, and the walk in crowd coming from the Coconut trees combined with the local car traffic and foot traffic may be an overload for the area. Likewise no one referenced all of these concerns then said they were minimal and should be overlooked.

In the normal sequence of planned events, I was the last speaker and began to describe the traffic problems anticipated at the front door.

The cheering squad gave me a few hisses, then one jumped and demanded the mike. . Over the mike he told me I knew nothing about traffic, that should be left to others and we should concentrate on getting the restaurant together. I once again started on the congestion description and a club member woman wanted the mike. Not wanting them to continue to expand the agitation I gave the mike to the woman and walked to the back. After her comments, the meeting closed.

Therefore, not only was there no conclusion drawn about the high volume of people that may occupy the front lawn and street, it was not ever discussed by any of the speakers.

Footnote: Mr. DiDanoto as the Mayor suggested, worked the crowd well, after describing his Italian background and his non-profit

Activities, he promised the crowd good rates on food sales and that he will be especially sensitive to non-profits with a small budget

Projected his earnings from the restaurants to be 5% and his private parties to be 95%, His cheering squad clapped and hollered on many occasions as he talked about the future of the restaurants. In a few years he will be a great candidate for some charity job.

Maybe I am jumping into conclusions here, and to be completely honest I have not been fully involved in this project regarding the pros and cons; but as an architecture graduate from





Dear Mayor & Commissioner of Coral Gables,

After carefully listening to the arguments presented against Mr. DiDonato's proposal for outdoor seating at the Coral Gables Country Club, it would appear that the objections to the outdoor seating is a red herring and that the real objection is to revitalizing the Country Club and all the increased traffic it would bring to the neighborhood. This is a valid objection and should be discussed and debated openly – not hidden behind the irrelevant issue of a few outdoor tables. The City needs to decide whether it wants a busy, successful and profitable Country Club to operate in a residential neighborhood. If the answer is yes – then Mr. DiDonato should be given the powers to operate it successfully. If the answer is no, then the building should be rezoned as a museum, or knocked down and made into a park for example. The third alternative is to send Mr. DiDonato back to Toronto and to leave the Club as an expensive and abandoned eyesore. If we do so, however, it is unlikely that any other developer will wish to follow in Mr. DiDonato's footsteps.

What most of the community wants is a place where we can walk to, to meet friends, relax, and have a quiet coffee or lunch. To compare this proposed small café to The Globe which offers music, a South Beach ambience and central location is entirely disingenuous. I'm sure Mr. DiDonato does not want to risk losing the café during or after the 18 month trial period for the café. My guess is that he'll do whatever it takes to stay under the radar and be a good neighbor. Certainly, the quality of life will not be negatively affected by the addition of a few outdoor tables, especially since the closest house in view of the café is .2 miles away.

If the City does indeed want the Country Club to be successful, then there are two very compelling arguments in favor of the "neighborhood" café and outdoor seating. Without

the full-time staff needed to operate the café and restaurant, the Club would only be able to offer service for major functions like weddings and reunions. The local residences again would be shut out and the club would mostly likely return to its mausoleum status. Secondly, without the visual welcome of outdoor seating to invite passing residents into the club, people would not realize that the Club was open to the public and it would remain the closed and exclusionary façade that it has always been.

It was very clear from the meeting on November 3rd that the vast majority of Gables residents, taxpayers and voters are strongly in favor of Mr. DiDonato's proposals. It was equally clear that the small but vocal opposition was limited to the residents of North Greenway. When my friends and I voted for you Mr. Mayor, and voted for your fellow Commissioners, we voted for you to represent the citizens of the City of Coral Gables. We did not vote you to be mayor of North Greenway Drive. Please do what is right and help create a sense of community that will make us all proud.

Dear City Commissioners,

I attended the meeting at the Coral Gables Country Club the other evening and understand that a decision on the issue of outdoor seating will be made on November 17th. I am strongly in favor of this for the following reasons:

- The Country Club is currently empty and will deteriorate if this continues quite apart from the financial drain this imposes on the City and therefore on residents who pay taxes (there are much better projects to spend our money on). If the Liberty Entertainment Group takes over I think the Club will actually become an asset rather than a drain and enhance the value of the surrounding property.
- I spoke to two of the neighbors on Granada who live directly in front on the club closest to the proposed outdoor seating area and yet they are both in favor of it. Given that Mr. Di Donato has offered an 18 month trial period for the café it would seem that we have absolutely nothing to lose by trying.
- Traffic (both pedestrian and automotive) on North and South Greenway is already heavier than on surrounding streets because those streets surround a public golf course. Anyone who bought there knew that already but bought anyway. They could have chosen to buy on a dead end street or a much quieter back street but did not. Regardless, I do not believe that outdoor seating at the club will substantially increase traffic at all. Regarding increased danger that traffic might cause to pedestrians. I think this is a non-issue. The danger to pedestrians, roller bladers, cyclists, etc. comes from the fact that there is no pathway or bike path on the perimeter of the golf course so people are forced onto the street.
- Most importantly, the outdoor café and seating will enable Country Club to become a part of the community rather than yet another expensive, elitist club. I have lived fairly close by on Sorolla Avenue for 13 years and yet this was only the second time I had ever set foot in it. I look forward to being able to walk over and meet my neighbors many of whom were at the meeting. Currently the only way to do this is to walk around the golf course (or come to a meeting).

We had a balcony from our bedroom overlooking the golf-course. The perfect place, we thought for morning coffee and the paper. No – too public. That is simply the price that you pay for living on the Greenway. It was like that 20 years ago when we lived there and I'm sure it is much worse now. (There were no cell phones when I lived there).

None of this will change, whether you have outdoor seating or not.

Whenever there has been a big event at the Country Club – or a big tournament at the Golf Club, there are overflow cars along North Greenway Drive adjacent to the Club.

Last night I heard many of my neighbors say the same thing – first visit. I was only familiar with the club because I used to attend monthly breakfast meetings for a business club that I belonged to; all the other members lived in Hollywood or Kendall – I was the only Gables member. The Club has never been part of the community and we are all delighted that you are finally going to change all that. You have tremendous local support behind you.

Leaders still split over outdoor café

Coral Gables commissioners are deadlocked over a proposal to allow outdoor seating at the Country Club of Coral Gables.

With tensions rising and patience running thin, Coral Gables commissioners were once again split over whether to allow the new operator of the Country Club of Coral Gables to open a café with outdoor seating North Greenway Drive.

The split vote -- two in favor and two against allowing Liberty Entertainment Group to put outdoor seating in the residential neighborhood -- means the commission will have to hear the matter one more time, as per a city rule. The item likely will be taken up at the December commission meeting.

“I am really disappointed,” said Liberty’s president, Nick Di Donato, after the meeting. “We were really hoping for a favorable response.”

Residents who live on North Greenway Drive argue that a café and restaurant with outdoor seating do not fit into the residential neighborhood.

“The zoning codes are in place for a reason,” said Russ Borden, who lives on North Greenway Drive, very close to the club.

But some say an outdoor café and restaurant will revive the club, which has been closed since April 2008 after the previous owner failed to pay rent payments. Lawsuits are still pending.

“I think we should give them the opportunity to be a successful commercial venture,” said Pippa Milne, who lives two blocks north of the club.

Liberty’s proposal originally called for 40 outdoor seats in the café and 68 seats in the restaurant. The company also said it would buffer the seating area with landscaping. After residents complained, the company reduced the outdoor seats to 32 in the café and 48 for the restaurant. The company also agreed to an 18-month trial period.

At the end of Tuesday’s discussion, Di Donato suggested a few more concessions: selling only beer and wine for the outdoor café; eliminating the outdoor restaurant seating on North Greenway and shutting down at 8 p.m.

“We are not going to sit here and negotiate,” said Vice Mayor William “Bill” Kerdyk.

Mayor Don Slesnick, who lives on North Greenway Drive a few houses away from the club, and Kerdyk -- for the third time -- voted against the plan. Commissioners Maria Anderson and Wayne “Chip” Withers voted to allow Liberty the trial period.

Commissioner Ralph Cabrera recused himself.

Cabrera, who spoke with Di Donato between the first and second reading of the proposed measure, cited Florida’s Jennings Rule as a reason for his recusal.

Under the rule, elected officials cannot discuss a topic in between first and second hearings with applicants.

Without Cabrera’s vote the commission has been deadlocked.

“The irony of this is if Ralph were here this would probably pass,” Withers said.

At a meeting in October, Slesnick suggested that Di Donato meet with the residents who live on North and South Greenway to see if he can get a consensus. Slesnick said after that meeting the commission would consider the seating one more time.

More than 140 people showed up for that meeting, held at the club. Most residents who live on North and South Greenway Drives were against the proposal; many who live nearby supported it.

Many residents also showed up at Tuesday's meeting.

Several questioned whether Slesnick should vote because he lives on the street.

“Your mind is made up because you have a stake in the outcome,” said resident Richard Namon.

Slesnick in an interview said he does not have a conflict and consistently votes in favor of protecting the city's zoning code. “I have been very consistent the whole time,” said Slesnick after the meeting. “This is not what the residents want.”

Coral Gables, former official settle for \$99K

Coral Gables' former Building and Zoning Director Margaret Pass will receive \$99,000 in exchange for dropping all potential lawsuits against the city.

The Coral Gables City Commission agreed Tuesday to pay nearly \$100,000 to settle a claim by the city's former Building and Zoning Director Margaret Pass that she was terminated without a cause.

Pass, who was fired in October 2007 for allegedly mismanaging the department, will receive \$99,000, and her status in her personnel file will be changed from being terminated to retired. In exchange, Pass agreed to drop all potential lawsuits against the city.

“This is a good settlement for the city,” said James C. Crosland, who is representing the city on this matter. “This is a case probably best put behind us.”

The city will pay Pass \$50,000 within 15 days of signing the agreement and \$49,000 within 12 months of the first payment.

The agreement prohibits either party from speaking to the media on the subject.

“The city attorney's office is authorized only to say, ‘the parties resolved the matter to their mutual satisfaction,’ ” the attorneys wrote in the agreement.

Tuesday's decision puts an end to a more than two-year dispute between the city and Pass.

Former city Manager David Brown fired Pass from her \$122,000-a-year job in October 2007 after allegations arose that Pass had city employees work at her Central Florida farm on taxpayers' dime. Brown at the time also said Pass had inappropriately allowed employees to take comp time.

Her firing came 13 months after her assistant, Jorge Reyes, was arrested on charges of approving time sheets for ghost workers who never worked for the city. He allegedly split the city money with the workers.

Police investigated the charges, but Police Maj. Ed Hudak has since said the investigation is nearly complete and no criminal charges were filed.

Pass had filed an appeal with the city's trial board, saying she was fired without cause. She withdrew her appeal in October.

Commissioners said Tuesday that they needed to get this behind them.

"We need to move on from this point," said Vice Mayor William "Bill" Kerdyk, who was one of three commissioners to vote in favor of the settlement. Commissioners Maria Anderson and Wayne "Chip" Withers also voted for the settlement.

Mayor Don Slesnick and Commissioner Ralph Cabrera voted against the agreement.

Slesnick said he didn't think the city should recognize Pass' years of service, as the agreement requires. Cabrera questioned whether the city should wait until the police investigation is complete.

"We may end up rewarding inappropriate behavior," Cabrera said.





After carefully listening to the arguments presented against Mr. DiDonato's proposal for outdoor seating at the Coral Gables Country Club, it would appear that the objections to the outdoor seating is a red

herring and that the real objection is to revitalizing the Country Club and all the increased traffic it would bring to the neighborhood. This is a valid objection and should be discussed and debated openly – not hidden behind the irrelevant issue of a few outdoor tables. The City needs to decide whether it wants a busy, successful and profitable Country Club to operate in a residential neighborhood. If the answer is yes – then Mr. DiDonato should be given the powers to operate it successfully. If the answer is no, then the building should be rezoned as a museum, or knocked down and made into a park for example. The third alternative is to send Mr. DiDonato back to Toronto and to leave the Club as an expensive and abandoned eyesore. If we do so, however, it is unlikely that any other developer will wish to follow in Mr. DiDonato's footsteps.

Thank you for your input on the application for a zoning change requested by the new tenant under a lease with the City to operate the building known as "The Country Club of Coral Gables". While zoning applications are considered quasi-judicial and, I have been advised by the city attorney that all communications should be held on the record so to prevent any allegations of undue prejudice, I have always responded in detail to all e-mails from my fellow citizens, regardless of the nature of the issue before the city commission. Furthermore, I have always placed those communications in the public record. Notwithstanding my responses to residents, I always maintain an open mind and consider the evidence and testimony presented at the public hearing, without undue consideration to any communication which I may have received. However, I have been advised that I should not offer my opinions on this matter until after the Commission's final vote. I have, however, cast a consistent ballot on this proposal at three separate hearings. While I will abide by the request not to discuss the matter privately, the following is a factual description of the events thus far. This application has been heard at public hearing by the city commission three times and is scheduled for final public hearing on December 15, 2009. The public comment portion of the proceedings have concluded and the city commission will be discussing the final aspects of the remaining issue for consideration, which is a request for approval for outdoor seating on what is now the North Greenway Drive front lawn of this historic property. The city commission has already considered and approved an amended site plan providing for landscaping, porte a cochere, additional exterior architectural features, valet operations and employee parking, to name a few. After review of the evidence submitted and consideration of the testimony, I voted with the majority on these issues. However, as to the final and remaining issue, I have been and continue to be concerned about the potential impacts of outdoor seating in residential areas. I have maintained an open mind and am prepared to listen to the pros and cons of this request at the final public hearing, as we discuss the matter amongst the city commissioners. As I have previously stated on the record, this is not a debate over the pros and cons of "outside dining" – there are outside dining areas at the club site which are approved and allowed within the current zoning – this is a site specific issue. As I have already stated on the record, the larger issue is whether the Commission should amend the zoning code to allow a commercial use in front of a building next to a sidewalk within a residential neighborhood. There may be future implications for other neighborhoods. To better understand the issue you may watch the taped broadcasts on Channel 77 or you may request DVD's of the meetings from Gables TV. Hi, Don!

I'm writing in support of including outdoor dining at the Country Club of Coral Gables. I'll outline my reasoning below:

1. Before the Club closed that last time, for renovations, Debbie and I became life members because we thought we were making an investment in our neighborhood. When the Club finally reopened, we thought that the food in the restaurant was really good. They had some excellent chefs, and it was a very nice restaurant. Almost always when we were there, the place was dead. Very few tables were ever occupied. The plan to open the restaurant to the public seems more than reasonable to me: it was simply not economically viable as a private dining establishment.
2. As the Episcopal Chaplain at the University of Miami, I have had first-hand experience of dealing with architectural limitations. Our Chapel has a very prominent location on campus, right on Stanford Drive. However, until 2003 we were architecturally invisible. From 1994-2003 I encountered so many students and employees who had no idea that there is a chapel of any sort on campus, people who walked or drove right by the Chapel every day! In 2003 we knocked a hole in the wall and built a prominent entrance. More than half of my students here are not Episcopalian. I always want to find out how students first discover us. Some learn about us from our presence at Orientation events, as has always been the case, but since 2003 we also have had students every year who simply "noticed that there's a church on campus." That never happened before the new entrance was built. [If you're curious about what I mean, I'd be happy to give you a quicky tour!] The Country Club was designed architecturally to be a private club. The *cognoscenti* know where the restaurant, bar, ballrooms, and pool entrance are, but for most folks passing by, the message sent by the design of the building is that that is private space and is not meant for them. For the public restaurant concept to work at the Country Club, there needs to be a visible and welcoming entry point. I believe that is why Nick Di Donato is so insistent on this point.
3. The way the Country Club building is now, the bar juts out all the way to the sidewalk to the south. This totally obstructs the proposed outdoor seating area from view until one is actually at the North Greenway/Granada intersection. Since the only "noise" would be the sound of conversation, I believe that the bar would also prevent sound from carrying east to the Club's immediate neighbors. While I understand the fear of the Greenway residents, I truly do believe that those folks who live closest to the Country Club on North Greenway to the east of Granada won't even notice the outdoor dining even when they're in their front yards. With the exception of the corner house, the North Greenway residents to the west of Granada would also not notice the outdoor dining, because of the angle of the roadway. (Incidentally, while most Greenway residents at last night's "neighborhood meeting" were opposed, at least two Greenway residents spoke in favor of the outdoor seating, including one woman who lives just five houses east of the Club.)
4. The area around the Country Club is a beautiful residential area. However, the North Greenway/Granada intersection is not a residential intersection. Only one of the four corners (northwest) has a house. The southwest corner is golf course. The northeast corner is the Country Club, technically a "private" building, but not a home: a building with a restaurant, a bar, a swimming pool, a large parking lot around back, and with cars coming and going, especially when there are large events such as weddings, bar mitzvahs, St. Philip's Galas, etc. The southeast corner is occupied by a public building, the club house for the golf course and Burger Bob's. The particular spot proposed for the outdoor seating is the one spot where one could do this without changing the nature of the area. The outdoor dining would only be visible when one is at that intersection, yet enough people go by that intersection to provide for walk-in business for the café, which would also serve as an entry point to the restaurant, etc. inside.
5. The Country Club in its most recent incarnation was simply not economically viable. It would be a real shame, not to mention a drag on the neighborhood, to have an abandoned building. I believe that the Country Club has great potential to be a wonderful neighborhood asset.

I suspect that you are getting a gazillion e-mails on this topic, both pro and con, so I don't expect you to reply to this e-mail. I just wanted you to have my perspective. I'm sure that you are feeling pressure from both sides and soon you will have to vote on this matter. I DO NOT ENVY YOU!



Dear Mayor Slesnick and Vice Mayor Kerdyk,

Thank you for giving Coral Gables residents the opportunity to express our opinions regarding outdoor seating at the Coral Gables Country Club at the recent public meeting.

As you know, there was overwhelming support for the café concept at that meeting. Over and over we heard, to great applause, from residents who have lived in the area for many years and never been inside the building before. They are thrilled at the prospect of making this venue a place that is truly and visibly open to residents.

The handful of N. Greenway residents who are opposed cited “danger” to strolling mothers and children. Far from being a danger, this proposed area would be a welcome spot for neighbors, finally opening up this marvelous treasure to all the neighborhood.

There seems to be a misunderstanding that this outdoor area would create the commercial atmosphere of a beer and pizza parlor, and that it would turn a residential neighborhood into an urban one. But most understand the difference between a residential area with a charming place for a chat and a latte, and an urban one. People who purchased homes on N. Greenway knew there was activity on the street, neighbors walking and jogging, golfers playing and chatting, etc. and this is part of its appeal. The café will only enhance the quality of life on this lovely boulevard.

Opponents also sited traffic and parking as reasons for opposition, but didn’t explain how a few outdoor tables would increase automobile traffic and parking needs.

The city took the first step in opting for the success that has evaded this venue for so long: You decided it should serve all residents rather than a select few.
