- a) March 2, 2018 Bike to Work Day – Approximately 40 people attended the event at the Coral Gables Museum. The purpose of the event was to help encourage people to look at alternative modes of transportation such as riding a bike to work to reduce the number of car trips within the City.
- b) 6th International Marine Debris Conference (San Diego) March 12-16 – 750 attendees from 50 different countries attended the conference in San Diego sponsored by NOAA. Matt presented on our Plastic Bags and Expanded Polystyrene legislation which received overwhelming support. Participants congratulated the City on being a leader in reducing marine debris.
