#### ROLL CALL

##### A. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

All Board Members approved minutes.

##### B. PUBLIC COMMENT

Comments provided by Sam Joseph:

- This year marks the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of end of Controlled Choice systems for school assignments. At the time of this change, there was a significant debate within the community regarding how this shift might impact the academic performance and overall environment of the schools. There has been a close involvement with the schools. A detailed report evaluating how schools have performed since the policy change is being prepared and will be shared with the community. The report will provide valuable information on student outcomes, school climate, and any notable trends or disparities.
- Many changes have been viewed as positive, especially regarding student experiences and outcomes. It is important to quantify these improvements through a comprehensive comparison report. This report will include a

grade-level evaluation to get an understanding on how students are performing across different academic stages.

- With micro-schools, private schools, and traditional school programs all playing a role, it's important to assess the broader educational landscape. There is a partnership with Barry University to create a private magnet school, which will give a holistic view of the current educational landscape.
- Such report will identify areas where improvements are needed and how much has already been done.
- Public schools serve as the foundation for providing universal access to education, regardless of a student's background or geographic location.

Board Member Goodman commented:

- Obtained current public records result on enrollment data for the past three years. This data will serve as a foundational component of the analysis, providing insights into trends, shifts in student populations.
- Provided general overall feedback from report.
- Overall results are positive.
- Number of students attending Coral Gables has dropped.
- Census data from 2024 indicates that overall, a 50% of Coral Gables families attend public schools.
- For a more in-depth analysis, the full report will be sent to Board Members for a more detailed review.

### C-1 Miami-Dade County Public Schools Update (Facilitated by Mari Tere Rojas, School Board Chair)

School Board Chair Rojas was unable to attend; Ms. Hernandez' Chair Roja's Chief of Staff read proffered items:

Additional comments from Maria Palacio-Chairman of Cristal Academy:

- Excited about item H-9 pursuant to establishing a comprehensive school choice concept and further awareness for autism spectrum disorders. Although she expressed her gratitude about the program, she also acknowledged that much work needs to be done.

Board member Goodman inquired about the budget workshops.

Carlos Pichardo commented: Rod Steiger indicated that their team is unaware about revenues and tax rates. It is a work in progress.

Further discussion was made pursuant to budget cuts in Tallahassee. In fact, the proposed tax cuts will impact on schools.

Carlos Pichardo further commented on the importance to advocate for schools and children's education with those elected officials.

This document does not represent a binding contract, but rather a starting point for formal discussions and negotiations. It will be refined through a collaboration among the city manager's office, the city attorney's office, the Intergovernmental office, and the school board attorney.
- Allow yourselves to be creative and think ahead, this will ensure a robust educational landscape.

Douglas Clark commented:

- When reviewing document, look far into the future such as five to ten years.
