

ITEM TITLE:

Resolution approving the Innovation and Technology (IT) Department to purchase OpenGov Enterprise services for Finance (Financial Transparency) and Asset Management (formerly Cartegraph); to waive the competitive process of the Procurement code as a Special Procurement/Bid waiver, pursuant to the Section 2-691 of the City's Procurement Code.

BRIEF HISTORY:

OpenGov is a public service, government-focused software-as-a-service (SaaS), cloud offering. In 2022 OpenGov acquired the SaaS service company, Cartegraph, a City vendor since 2016 providing management of City assets and facilities for Public Works. OpenGov had been a vendor to the City since 2019, providing financial transparency and public-facing dashboards for citizens.

Since the acquisition of Cartegraph by OpenGov, IT looks to combine the payment for services into one recurrent purchase. The annual renewal of both product services will be done under a 5-year price commitment at \$113,000 per year or in an amount not to exceed the available budget. The pricing includes all licensing and support for both the Finance and Public Works products and services.

Under Section 2-691 of the Procurement Code, entitled "Special Procurement/Bid Waiver," a special procurement may be initiated when an unusual or unique situation exists that makes the application of all requirements of competitive sealed bidding or competitive sealed proposal contrary to the public interest.
