### **H. ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Tony Ulivarri, Assistant Superintendent of Inter-Governmental Affairs Former Principal at Coral Gables High School joined via Zoom.

- There are several bus depots throughout the County: North to South.
- Regarding electric buses, however, uncertain how they are distributed.
- A proposal has been submitted; ultimately it will be reviewed by their board.
- Details associated with the 2-mile radius to school are delineated in the Florida Statute 1011.68.
- Another municipality has brought up a similar concern, lobbying will be done to try to amend and reduce the 2-mile radius to 1.5 miles. A transportation

survey has been conducted this will provide transportation to approximately 17,000 students in the district and will allow an increase in the number of buses. Looking into increasing bus drivers.

Chair Chang mentioned that it would be a good idea to introduce electric buses.

Vice Chairperson, Slesnick inquired if it is historically known what the number of students using the bus transportation.

Mr. Ulivarri, the number is captured, however, will inquire transportation service for details on these numbers for the next meeting.

Board Member inquired if there is knowledge of the number of electric buses in existence and additional buses will be added.

Mr. Ulivarri, with recent significant cuts at the Federal level that have greatly impacted this program.

Facilities Expert was invited to meeting and is participating via Zoom- Ivan Rodriguez; Miami-Dade County Public Schools will provide updates on impact fees:

- \$22 to \$27 million dollars have been collected annually from 2020 thru 2024. Also collected from various Coral Gables projects have been collected \$2 million and the expenditure has been approximately \$1.3 million dollars. Additional comments were mentioned.

Further discussions were finalized as to the Education Compact's priorities with liaison, Granell. In essence the top three priorities are:

- Educational Excellence.
- Faculty staff retention/recruitment.
- Classroom program enrichment.
- Healthy Kids.
- Promoting Schools.
- Mobility.
- Safety

Another important aspect is to consider and highlight children with disabilities.
