Returning to the Bethlehem area this summer is tennis pro Bill Aronson of Coral Gables, Florida, who recently served on a task force to build a program in Cuba to provide children with education and tennis programs in-school, afterschool, and during the summer. He was a Research Fellow at the Center for the Study of Sport in Society at Northeastern University, a former administrator of sport science for the USTA, and a former Harry Hopman Tennis Professional.



### TAMPA BAY PLAYERS DOMINATE SENIOR GAM

Clearwater played host to the 24th annual Florida Senior Games and its 24 sports for athletes at least 50 years of age. It was the first time the Olympic-style competition was scheduled in the Tampa Bay area since the Games' inception in 1992. In all, more than 2,000 athletes participated.

Innisbrook Resort was selected as host of the tennis competition in men's and women's singles, doubles and mixed doubles.

Over 120 players competed in the three-day event.

"The atmosphere was absolutely amazing," said Sarah Kirschberg, who has coordinated the FSG tennis competition the last four years. "Pam Collins and her staff at Innisbrook did a fantastic job and players from the recreational to the really-skilled level seemed to all have a very positive experience."

Tampa Bay area players won 12 gold medals spread among singles, doubles and mixed divisions. Double gold winners were Dan Beck, Arthur Burns and Debbie Hobbs.

Hobbs won her golds in women's 60-64 singles and in 60-64 mixed doubles with husband Steve. Burns, playing in his first Games' competition, won men's singles in the 70-74 division and men's doubles in 70-74 with Chip Gamble. Beck won the men's 55-59 singles and the 55-59 doubles with partner Mike Kowal.

"I last played in the Florida Senior Games ages ago and



really enjoyed it then," said Beck. "There were eight of us in this singles draw with a variety of levels. The final was an incredible match and came down to a third-set tiebreak. I definitely plan on playing in the 2016 Games."

The other six gold medals were earned in singles by Teresa Thompson in the 50-54 division and Dee Dolson in 55-59. Doubles winners, along with Beck and Kowal in 5-59 and Burns and Gamble in 75-79, included Terry Tetzlaff & Richard Whissel in 70-74, Anne Pulley & Jenny Bell 50-54, Emily Signoracci & Debbie Dawson 60-64 and Ann Worthington & Susan Hobbs 65-69.

Joining Tampa Bay area gold medal winners in women's singles were Martha Poitevent of East Palatka in 65-69, Carolyn Brown of Lake City 70-74, Merlin Nuti-de Biasi 75-79 and Charlotte Fisher of New York 80-84.

In men's singles were John Steinmann of Ponte Vedra Beach in 60-64. Gabriel Wong of Ponte Vedra 65-69, Julian Rainwater of Jacksonville 70-74, Thomas Winn of Leesburg 80-84 and Edmund Krowka of Port St. Lucie 85-89.

Susie Dudevoire and Vickie Miller of Bradenton in the 5559 division round out the women's doubles' winners and were joined by men's champions Steinmann and John Baker in 60-64, Scott Campbell and Aubrey Whitaker of Lake Wales 65-69 and David Bonnar and Russell Reinhard of Melbourne 85-89.

Aubrey Whitaker teamed with his wife Judi in the 65-69 division to win their fourth overall mixed doubles title.




