**MOTIONS:**

***January 27, 2021 & February 24, 2021 SAB meeting minutes – Enrique made a motion to approve the draft meeting minutes, Martin Seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.***

**Martin made a motion to elect Mr. Bernal as Vice Chair of the Board until the end of his term, Greg seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.**

**PHYSICAL QUORUM (5): Monique, Enrique, Martin, Marlin, and Rita**

Enrique announced that after 6 years of service with the Board, he will be resigning at the end of his term. Enrique said that it has been a wonderful and special experience serving. He will accept the position as Vice Chair until the end of his term.

The Chair announced that at yesterday's Commission meeting there was a Proclamation for Earth Month Enrique was present at the Commission representing the Board and accepted the proclamation along with Matt. In addition, Enrique and Matt announced that the prescription drop-off box at the new Police & Fire Headquarters is going to be installed in the very near future as per Chief Hudak.

Matt mentioned that at the February 9, 2021 commission meeting, Miami Dade County and the Army Corp of Engineers presented the Miami Dade Back-Bay study. It looks at reducing the impact of storm surge and flooding throughout the County. At the beginning the City of Coral Gables was not included in any of their infrastructure plan. As they were re-running some of the flood modeling, they found if hit with a large storm there would be some flooding that would penetrate through the Coral Gables waterway and so they added proposed flooding infrastructure included into Coral Gables and the Coral Gables waterways. Solanch has the presentation, Matt wanted to mention it so that the Board is aware about it, the only thing that is funded now, is the study that they are doing, then it goes through Federal Funding in two to 3 years. Their main concern is protecting critical structures like Fire Stations, Police, Hospital's, and homes. What they are proposing is a flood gate at the Cartagena Circle waterway to only be closed when on-coming storm, to reduce flooding impacts inland, a smaller flood gate at the Snapper Creek canal (S22) and an associated flood wall. The Army Corp estimates the flooding structures would help reduce flooding impacts to approximately 8,500 structures in the City of Coral Gables. The study is still in its early stages and there will be an extensive amount of community engagement throughout each phase.

### *Grant Update:*

### *Great American Cleanup Season:*

Program Time Frame: March 20<sup>th</sup> – June 21<sup>st</sup>  
Officially Kicked-off Plogging at Matheson Event

- Event registration was capped at 59 volunteers.
