Our records indicate that you, as the Owner and/or Occupant of the premises at:

still are in violation of the following sections of the City Code of the City of Coral Gables:

Sec. 82-29. - Permits generally.

(e)Pruning of trees on public property and rights-of-way. The pruning of any trees on public property and rights-of-way is prohibited unless expressly approved by the tree preservation agency in advance.

(Ord. No. 2017-45, § 2(Att. A), 12-5-2017)

The following steps need to be taken to correct the violation:

Remedy: Must obtain a certified arborist report (tree assessment), and an "After the Fact" permit for pruning of 3 trees on city right of way per Chapter 82-29.

As a result of the above violation(s), a complaint has been filed against you and you are hereby commanded to appear before the Code Enforcement Board for a hearing on 5/20/2026 at 08:30 AM in the Commission Chambers, located at:

This is your notice to appear at said time and place. Failure to do so will result in the matter being heard in absentia. An administrative fee of \$108.75 will be assessed at the time of your hearing.

Please be advised that if someone will be attending the hearing on your behalf, he or she must provide a power of attorney from you at the time of the hearing.

If this notice pertains to failure to maintain a historic structure, please be advised that:

- You may be subject to substantial fines that may not be mitigated
- You may also be required to repair or restore the historic structure.
- If the historic structure is allowed to deteriorate to the point where it must be demolished:
 - The City Code requires that you replace the structure with a similar historically appropriate structure; and
 - The property will no longer qualify for an historic preservation tax exemption
