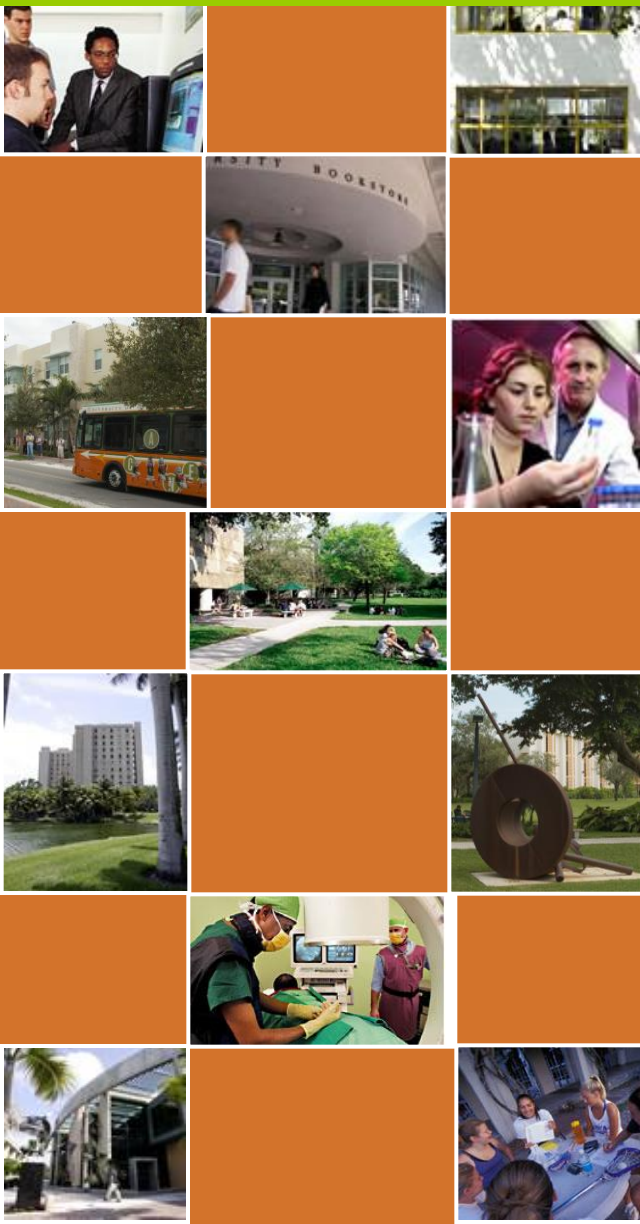

Driving Community Progress

*A major South Florida  
presence...  
In Miami-Dade County*

- \$4.5 B in total economic impact
- \$2 B in labor income
- 42,100 employment positions
- \$2.6 B in gross county product (the county's estimated GDP)
- \$108 M in state and local government fiscal revenues (\$50 million to local tax jurisdictions)

## Driving Community Progress

### *In the City of Coral Gables...*

- \$1.23 billion in total economic impact
- \$579 million in labor income to workers within the city
- 11,256 employment positions
- \$754 million in gross city product (Coral Gables estimated GDP)
- \$33 million in revenues to state and local governments (approximately \$14 million to local taxing jurisdictions)
