ITEM TITLE:

Resolution. A Resolution of the City Commission of the City of Coral Gables, Florida, recognizing the City’s longstanding relationship with the Granada Golf Association, Inc., Greenway Women’s Golf Association, Inc., and the Coral Gables Women’s Golf and Bridge Association, Inc.; authorizing the continued administrative reservation of certain tee time blocks for existing members of such associations, subject to applicable legal, operational, and financial requirements established by the City; and directing staff to work with the existing associations under those conditions.

BRIEF HISTORY:

The City of Coral Gables owns and operates the historic Granada Golf Course as a public golf facility intended to serve residents and the general public. For many decades, the Granada Golf Association, Inc., Greenway Women’s Golf Association, Inc., and the Coral Gables Women’s Golf and Bridge Association, Inc. have maintained longstanding relationships with the Granada Golf Course and have contributed to the promotion of recreational golf, community engagement, and organized play.

These organizations have served the community for significant periods of time, with the Granada Golf Association and Greenway Women’s Golf Association each operating for more than sixty years, and the Coral Gables Women’s Golf and Bridge Association serving the community for more than ninety years. Their historical presence reflects a longstanding tradition of organized golf activity at the municipal course.

The proposed Resolution recognizes the City’s ongoing relationship with these associations and authorizes staff to continue working with them regarding the administrative reservation of certain tee time blocks for existing members. Any such tee time allocations shall remain under the sole direction and control of City staff and the City Manager or designee. Allocations may be established, adjusted, or modified based on course capacity, seasonal demand, operational conditions, financial considerations, and the City’s obligation to preserve public access to the municipal facility.

The Resolution does not create any exclusive or vested rights in tee times or course access, but instead affirms the City’s intent to balance historical association use with the needs of the general public and efficient course operations.
