



The park currently known as "Washington Park" is not historically designated, nor is it located within a historic district. Renaming the park will have no adverse effect on any of the City's historical resources.

The Historical Resources Department wholeheartedly supports the application to name a park after William Alexander Cooper. Mr. Cooper lived his entire life in the neighborhood adjacent to the park.
