## CITY OF CORAL GABLES, FLORIDA RESOLUTION NO. 2025-157

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO FORMULATE A PLAN TO ELIMINATE THE ANNUAL SOLID WASTE FEE AND EXPLORE OTHER WASTE SAVING OPPORTUNITIES

**WHEREAS**, the City of Coral Gables currently imposes an annual solid waste fee on residential properties to fund the provision of solid waste collection services; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Commission has expressed interest in eliminating the annual solid waste fee as a means of providing financial relief to residents, while maintaining essential public services; and

**WHEREAS**, the Commission recognizes the need for a fiscally responsible and operationally sustainable plan that identifies cost-saving alternatives and new revenue sources before eliminating the fee; and

**WHEREAS**, the Commission believes that one option would be to provide alternative waste options for green matter pickup, drop-off and reuse;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CORAL GABLES:

**SECTION 1.** That the foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution upon the adoption hereof.

**SECTION 2.** The City Commission hereby directs the City Manager to formulate a comprehensive plan for the elimination of the annual solid waste fee including but not limited to:

- 1. Assessing the financial feasibility and timeline for eliminating the solid waste fee;
- 2. Meeting with Commissioner Fernandez to investigate options to divert green waste from the waste stream through city-managed drop-off locations and innovative processing technologies (e.g., biochar production);
- 3. Exploring potential partnerships with neighboring municipalities (e.g., South Miami, West Miami, Pinecrest) for shared-use waste management facilities;
- 4. Reviewing alternative service models, including voluntary programs or incentive-based approaches for landscaper participation;
- 5. Evaluating how changes could affect capital budgets, the General Fund, and service equity between single-family and multi-family/commercial properties.

**SECTION 3.** The City Commission hereby directs that options and findings be presented to the City Commission no later than August 2025.

**SECTION 4.** That this Resolution shall become effective upon the date of its passage and adoption herein.
