Unitec Response:

How work will be accomplished

After the notice to proceed is issued, Unitec will begin designing construction plans for all four phases. Construction plans will be submitted for permitting to the City of Coral Gables. Once permits are approved, Unitec will call Sunshine 811 for locates and send personnel to conduit Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR) of all four phases. Once all utilities have responded to the locates and GPR is complete, Unitec will secure parking for mobilization of equipment, coordinate with City of Coral Gables off-duty police, and manage any required lane closure approvals. Construction will commence with directional boring to install conduits based on the approved permits per phase followed by installation of handholes and tie-ins. Later, fiber will be pulled, spliced, and tested. Finally, restoration will be completed. Unitec will request substantial completion of work and ask for a walk-thru with the city. If the city creates punch list items, Unitec will address them right away. Finally, we will design the as-built plans for each phase, submit to the city for review and request final inspection to close out all permits.

Unitec recommends having bi-weekly progress monitoring meetings with the City of Coral Gables Project Manager assigned to this project.

Timeline

The preliminary timeline after notice to proceed will be:

- 1. Design Construction Plans- approximately 4 weeks for all phases.
- 2. Permits- contingent on City of Coral Gables' approval.
- 3. Call for locates and complete internal Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR)approximately 4 weeks for all phases.
- 4. Directional bore by phase based on permit approval and locates clearingapproximately 3 weeks per phase.
- 5. Install handholes and tie-ins- approximately 3 weeks per phase.
- 6. Pull fiber, fiber splicing and testing- approximately 2 weeks per phase.
- 7. Restoration- approximately 3 weeks per phase.
- 8. As-builts will be designed and submitted to the City of Coral Gables- approximately 4 weeks for all phases.
- 9. Final inspection and close all permits- contingent on City of Coral Gables.



The right also includes timely and reasonable access to the respondent's personnel during normal business hours for the purpose of interview and discussion related to such documents. This right of access shall continue as long as records are retained.
- Record Retention: Respondent will retain of all required records pertinent to this contract for a period of three years, beginning on a date as described in 2 C.F.R. §200.333 and retained in compliance with 2 C.F.R. §200.333.
- 17. Federal Changes: Respondent shall comply with all applicable Federal agency regulations, policies, procedures and directives, including without limitation those listed directly or by reference, as they may be amended or promulgated from time to time during the term of the contract.
- 18. <u>Termination for Default (Breach or Cause)</u>: If a contract is entered into, the Respondent acknowledges that if it fails to perform in the manner called for in the contract, or if the Respondent fails to comply with any other provisions of the contract, the City may terminate the contract for default. - Safeguarding Personal Identifiable Information: Respondent will take reasonable measures to safeguard protected personally identifiable information and other information designated as sensitive by the awarding agency or is considered sensitive consistent with applicable Federal, state and/or local laws regarding privacy and obligations of confidentiality.
- 20. **Prohibition on utilization of cost plus a percentage of cost contracts**: The City will not award contracts containing Federal funding on a cost plus percentage of cost basis.
- Energy Policy and Conservation Act (43 U.S.C.§6201): All contracts except micro-purchases (\$3000 or less, except for construction contracts over \$2000). Contracts shall comply with mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency, stating in the state energy conservation plan issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation act. (Pub. L. 94-163, 89 Stat. 871) [53 FR 8078, 8087, Mar. 11, 1988, as amended at 60 FR 19639, 19645, Apr. 19, 1995].
- 22. Domestic Preference: As appropriate and to the extent consistent with law, the Contractor should, in accordance with Section 2-699 of the City Code and 2 C.F.R. § 200.322 under Title 2 of the Code of Federal Regulations, to the greatest extent practicable under a Federal award, provide a preference for the purchase, acquisition, or use of goods, products, or materials produced in the United States (including but not limited to iron, aluminum, steel, cement, and other manufactured products). For purposes of this section:
 - a. "Produced in the United States" means, for iron and steel products, that all manufacturing processes, from the initial melting stage through the application of coatings, occurred in the United States.
 - b. "Manufactured products" means items and construction materials composed in whole or in part of non-ferrous metals such as aluminum; plastics and polymer-based products such as polyvinyl chloride pipe; aggregates such as concrete; glass, including optical fiber; and lumber.

- 23. <u>Telecommunications Equipment or Services</u>: It is prohibited, as described in section 889(b)(1) of the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019 (FY 2019 NDAA)1 and 2 C.F.R. § 200.216.2, for any FEMA award funds to be used in the procurement, the entering into or extending or renewing of a contract for the purpose of obtaining any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology of any system.  - iv. Telecommunications or video surveillance equipment or services produced or provided by an entity that the Secretary of Defense, in consultation with the Director of National Intelligence or the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, reasonably believes to be an entity owned or controlled by, or otherwise connected to, the government of a covered foreign country.
- 24. <u>Contract with the Enemy:</u> In accordance with 2 C.F.R. 200.215, it is acknowledged that no services under this contract are to be performed outside the United states and its territories nor in support of a contingency operation in which members of the Armed Forces are actively engaged in hostilities.

SCHEDULE "L" - CONTRACTOR CERTIFICATION WORK HOURS AND SAFETY STANDARDS ADDENDUM

This certification is incorporated as part of the contract for IFB 2022-015 - Fiber Optic Backbone Expansion Project.

The Contractor acknowledges and certifies that in accordance with the mandatory requirement that this provision be set forth in all FEMA related contracts, that it shall comply with 40 U.S.C. 3702 and 3704, as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 5).

Under 40 U.S.C. s. 3702, each contractor must be required to compute the wages of every mechanic and laborer on the basis of a standard work week of 40 hours. Work in excess of the standard work week is permissible provided that the worker is compensated at a rate of not less than one and a half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of 40 hours in the work week.

The requirements of 40 U.S.C. s. 3704 are applicable to construction work and provide that no laborer or mechanic must be required to work in surroundings or under working conditions which are unsanitary, hazardous or dangerous. Such liquidated damages shall be computed with respect to each individual laborer or mechanic, including watchmen and guards, employed in violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(1) of this section, in the sum of \$25 for each calendar day on which such individual was required or permitted to work in excess of the standard workweek of forty hours without payment of the overtime wages required by the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(1) of this section.

(3) Withholding for unpaid wages and liquidated damages. 
