2023 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

The upcoming 60-day Legislative Session will begin on March 7, 2023. The Interim-Committee weeks prior to March have not yet been announced, but are expected to take place after the November Organization Session. To prepare for the upcoming Session, we suggest the following timeline:

June - August: This is when the Governor's Agencies begin to develop their proposed budgets.

- Devise our 2023 Session policy and budget strategy.
- Educate elected and state officials on the importance of the City's priorities.
- Compile materials and leave behinds for member meetings.

September - December: State agencies present their Long-Range Program Plan that outlines five years of priority programs, budget needs and agency implementation goals by September 30th. By October 15th, the Program Plans help shape agency Legislative Budget Requests (LBRs), which provide breakdowns of how much money agencies require for personnel and other needs.

- Meet officials within relevant state agencies and legislative committee staff.
- Make introductions between the City and the Governor's Office leadership team.
- After the General Election (November 8th) an Organization Session will take place in Tallahassee.

January/February: The Governor uses the LBRs to make his budget recommendations for each state agency. His proposed budget must be presented 30 days before the beginning of legislative session.

- Interim Committee Weeks will take place. Dates are to be announced.
- Secure bill sponsors and complete necessary appropriations project request forms.
- Monitoring bill drafts and filings that may affect the City's operations.

March - May: The 60-day legislative session will kick off on March 7th. During session, we will navigate the budget process in both chambers, ensuring bills are heard in their respective committee stops. During the last week of session, budget conference will take place where each chamber negotiates their budget priorities.

- Follow House Rules (TBA) on filing appropriations requests.
- Submit Senate Local Funding Initiative Request (LFIR) form.
- Navigate the appropriations projects process in each chamber to ensure bills are heard.

May - July: The Governor will be sent the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 budget in the early Summer. Your Southern Group team will continue to work with the Governor's office and ensure budgets items and potential legislation is acted upon in the City's best interest.

RELATIONSHIPS ARE KEY

Relationship building and advocacy are The Southern Group's core competency. The Southern Group and Ronald L. Book, P.A. have great relationships with just about every elected official, stakeholder and decision maker in Tallahassee and throughout Florida, all of which have been, and will continue to be utilized advocating on behalf the City's funding and policy priorities. INFLUENCE ON POLICY

Over several legislative sessions, the Legislature increasingly files a variety of policy issues negatively affecting local governments. Collectively, our firms have been at the center of this debate, working to keep local government priorities at the forefront and included as part of changing policy, as these proposals are considered. Below are a few examples of our work on behalf of local governments.

SB 974/HB 985, Sovereign Immunity: In the 2022 Session and over the last several legislative sessions as well, the Legislature has pursued a variety of bills that would have restructured sovereign immunity to increase the caps for damages against local governments, per person and per incident, implemented an annual adjustment to the cap based on the Consumer Price Index, made changes to statute of limitations, among other issues, all of which would have a significant negative fiscal impact. We continually work with key legislators to voice strong opposition on behalf of local governments.

HB 403/SB 280, Local Ordinance Preemption Bills: During the 2022 legislative session, we worked with other stakeholder groups, including the Florida League of Cities to limit the impact this bill would have on the City. While changes were made, ultimately, we were successful in keeping these bills from moving forward.

HB 7053/SB 1940, Statewide Flooding & Sea Level Rise Resiliency- Sponsored by Coral Gables Representative Demi Busatta Cabrera, this bill expanded on legislation passed last year and established a statewide Office of Resilience to be housed within the Executive Office of the Governor.

HB 17, Community Redevelopment Agencies: During the 2018 legislative session, we successfully kept this bill from moving forward in the Senate and stopped an effort on the last day of session to amend the bill's language onto a different bill.

HB 243, Charter County & Regional Transportation System Surtax Preemption: During the 2018 legislative session, HB 243 would have caused a \$100 million deficit in the County's transportation department. We were successful in amending the bill to allow municipalities to continue to use their portion of the surtax to fund their trolley systems, but the bill ultimately died in the Senate.

MONITORING AND REPORTING

The Southern Group strives to keep our clients engaged and informed throughout the year. Our daily newsletter, *What's Trending Florida*, offers a high-level, insider's point-of-view of what is happening at all levels of government. Throughout the interim committee weeks and legislative session our team will provide bill and committee reports relative to the City's areas of interests. Upon the conclusion of Legislative Session, our team takes a deep dive into the budget and provides budget summaries by silos for our clients to better understand the funding resources available in the upcoming year(s).

When the legislature is not in Session, our team hosts webinars for our clients to stay engaged in policy discussions and further build their relationships with decision makers.
