RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE A **RECOMMENDATION OF THE CHIEF PROCUREMENT** OFFICER TO AUTHORIZE PARTICIPATION IN A PIGGYBACK CONTRACT WITH COMTECH **ENGINEERING, INC., FOR NEW CONSTRUCTION AND REPAIRS OF WATER AND SEWER MAINS IN** ACCORDANCE WITH **SECTION 2-978.** OF THE PROCUREMENT CODE ENTITLED "USE OF OTHER **GOVERNMENTAL UNIT CONTRACTS (PIGGYBACK)."**

WHEREAS, Section 2-978 of the Procurement Code, provides that the Commission may approve contracts of other governmental units, which contracts have resulted from a formal competitive bid process, awarded to the lowest, responsive and responsible bidder meeting specifications; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Procurement Officer in consultation with the Public Works Director has determined that Comtech Engineering, Inc., will best meet the needs of the City; and

WHEREAS, Section 2-650 of the Procurement Code authorizes the City Manager to delegate authority to the Chief Procurement Officer to administer and make recommendations on City contracts;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CORAL GABLES:

SECTION 1. The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution upon adoption hereof.

SECTION 2. That the Commission accepts the recommendation of the Chief Procurement Officer, to authorize participation in a piggyback contract with Comtech Engineering, Inc., for new construction and repairs of water and sewer mains in accordance with Section 2-978, of the Procurement Code entitled "Use of Other Governmental Unit Contracts (Piggyback)."

SECTION 3. That this Resolution shall become effective upon the date of its adoption herein.
