A Resolution accepting the recommendation of the Chief Procurement Officer to award the Citywide Infiltration and Inflow Abatement contracts to EnviroWaste Services Group, Inc., for Excavated Point Repairs, Lateral Lining, and Sectional Lining (Group A) in the amount of \$776,462, and for Manhole Rehabilitation (Group B) in the amount of \$238,558; and to Insituform Technologies, LLC, for Mainline Lining (Group C) in the amount of \$1,206,082; pursuant to Invitation For Bids (IFB) 2015.10.07, and Section 2-828 of the Procurement Code entitled "Contract Award," for a total project amount of \$2,221,102.

Mayor Cason: Alright, let's move on to H-2. This is a resolution, Procurement.

Chief Procurement Officer Pounds: Mike Pounds, Chief Procurement Officer. The purpose of

the comprehensive infiltration and inflow IFB is to rehabilitate deteriorated sanitary sewer

systems within the City, which are average age, about 50 years old. The project was divided up

into three workgroups. The first group was excavated point repairs, lateral lining and sectional

lining. That was Group A. Manhole rehabilitation was Group B, and Mainline lining was Group

C. On October 7, Procurement Division issued the Citywide Infiltration and Inflow Abatement

IFB. And on October 21, we had a pre-bid conference, and we only had one prospective bidder

attend out of the eighteen that picked up the package. On December 10, we had nine bids

submitted on this IFB. EnviroWaste Services Group, which was a firm we have used for various

services on our sanitary system in the past, was determined to be lowest responsible responsive

bid for excavated point repairs, later lining, and sectional lining, Group A, with a total bid of

\$776, 462 and also for manhole rehabilitation, Group B, with a total bid of \$238,558. The lowest

responsive responsible bidder for mainline lining group, Group C, was Insituform Technologies,

with a total bid of \$1,206,082. The total cost of the project is \$2,221,102. The City's consultant,

Hazen and Sawyer, and the Public Works Department concur with this recommendation to award

to EnviroWaste and to Insituform.
