1. APPLICATION REQUEST

The City of Coral Gables is requesting review and consideration of the following:

An Ordinance of the City Commission of Coral Gables, Florida providing for a text amendment to the City of Coral Gables Official Zoning Code, Article 4, "Zoning Districts," Division 4, "Prohibited Uses," Section 4-411, "Parking in residential areas;" amending the provisions for loading and unloading of commercial vehicles within residential districts and within a specified distance of residential districts; providing for repealer provision, severability clause, codification, and providing for an effective date.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

City Staff, at the request of the City Commission, has prepared a Zoning Code text amendment amending the provisions for loading and unloading of commercial vehicles within residential districts.

Currently, the loading or unloading of trucks, trailers or commercial vehicles is allowed within residential districts, provided that such loading or unloading takes less than two (2) hours and occurs between the hours of 7:00 AM and 7:00 PM. The proposed amendment would leave these restrictions in place and add a provision that they would apply to all properties within one-hundred (100) feet of residential districts.

3. PROPOSED ZONING CODE TEXT AMENDMENT

The proposed Zoning Code text amendment is provided below in strikethrough/underline format.

Article 4 - Zoning Districts

Division 4. Prohibited Uses

Section 4-411. Parking, loading or unloading in residential areas-and neighboring districts.

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person to park any vehicle displaying advertising signs or any truck, trailer, commercial vehicle, or recreational vehicle, in or upon any property, public or private, in any area of the City in a residential district. This prohibition, however shall not apply in the following cases:
 - 1. Vehicles which are entirely enclosed within the confines of an enclosed garage.
 - 2. Vehicles used by licensed contractors or service establishments while actually doing work in such residential areas between the hours of 7:30 AM to 6:00 PM excluding Sundays and holidays, provided, however, that such vehicles shall contain written identification on both sides of the vehicle clearly indicating the name of the contractor or service establishment. Such identification shall be in conformance with the standards set forth in Section 8A-276(b), Commercial Vehicle Identification, of the Code of Metropolitan Dade County, Florida.
 - 3. Loading or unloading of trucks, trailers or commercial vehicles provided that such loading or unloading takes no more than two (2) hours, and is not done between the hours of 7:00 PM of one day and 7:00 AM of the next day.
 - 4. Vehicles carrying a sign displaying only a noncommercial message, including, but not limited to, a sign dealing with the candidacy of individuals for elected office.
 - The loading or unloading of recreational vehicles as provided for under this Section.
 - 6. Mobile cranes and other heavy equipment used during building construction.
 - 7. One pickup truck may be parked outside of a residence if all three of the following requirements are met:
 - a. There are no items in the bed of the vehicle.
 - b. The vehicle has no commercial markings or advertising, and no commercial equipment or appendage is attached to the exterior of the vehicle.

- c. The vehicle is unmodified and has no more than four (4) wheels.
- B. Loading or unloading of trucks, trailers or commercial vehicles is allowed, provided that such loading or unloading shall take no more than two (2) hours, and shall not be done between the hours of 7:00 PM of one day and 7:00 AM of the next day within residential districts or within one-hundred (100) feet of residential districts.

4. FINDINGS OF FACT

In accordance with Section 3-1405 of the Zoning Code, the Planning and Zoning Board shall not recommend adoption of, and the City Commission shall not adopt, text amendments to the Zoning Code unless the text amendment:

- A. Promotes the public health, safety, and welfare.
- B. Does not permit uses the Comprehensive Plan prohibits in the area affected by the district boundary change or text amendment.
- C. Does not allow densities or intensities in excess of the densities and intensities which are permitted by the future land use categories of the affected property.
- D. Will not cause a decline in the level of service for public infrastructure which is the subject of a concurrency requirement to a level of service which is less the minimum requirements of the Comprehensive Plan.
- E. Does not directly conflict with an objective or policy of the Comprehensive Plan.

Staff finds that all five of these criteria are satisfied.

5. COMPREHENSIVE PLAN CONSISTENCY

In accordance with Section 3-1407 of the Zoning Code, the Planning and Zoning Board shall determine whether the Zoning Code text amendment is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan. Staff finds that the proposed text amendment <u>is consistent</u> with the Comprehensive Plan overall, particularly with the following Goals, Objectives and Policies:

Goal FLU-1. Protect, strengthen, and enhance the City of Coral Gables as a vibrant community
ensuring that its neighborhoods, business opportunities, shopping, employment centers, cultural
activities, historic value, desirable housing, open spaces, and natural resources make the City a
very desirable place to work, live and play.

- Policy FLU-1.3.2. All development applications in residential neighborhoods shall continue to be reviewed by applicable boards and committees to ensure the protection from intrusion by incompatible uses that would disrupt or degrade the health, safety, tranquility, aesthetics and welfare of the neighborhood by noise, light, glare, odor, vibration, dust, hazardous materials or traffic. The City will continue to enforce the adopted restrictive design standards; historic preservation policies and the applicable performance standards of the Commercial Limited designation in the Zoning Code.
- Policy FLU-1.3.3. Non-residential uses designated in the Comprehensive Plan which cause significant noise, light, glare, odor, vibration, dust, hazardous conditions or industrial traffic, shall provide buffering such as landscaping, walls and setbacks, when located adjacent to or across the street from incompatible uses such as residential uses.
- Objective FLU-1.9. Encourage sound innovation in the development standards of the City's Zoning Code which provides a continuing process to respond to community needs.
- Objective FLU-1.14. The City shall enforce Zoning Code provisions which continue to preserve and improve the character of neighborhoods.
- Goal DES-1. Maintain the City as a livable city, attractive in its setting and dynamic in its urban character.
- Policy DES-1.1.5. Promote the development of property that achieves unified civic design and proper relationship between the uses of land both within zoning districts and surrounding districts, by regulating, limiting and determining the location, height, density, bulk and massing, access to light and air, area of yards, open space, vegetation and use of buildings, signs and other structures.
- Policy DES-1.1.6. Maintain the character of the residential and nonresidential districts, and their peculiar suitability for particular uses.
