CALL TO ORDER:

Ms. Keller called the meeting to order at 5:45 p.m. – This is the first meeting of the Waterway Advisory Board; Members and staff introduced themselves.

MEETING MINUTES APPROVAL:

MOTIONS/ACTIONS

- Mr. Galan made a motion that Mr. Chamizo serve as Chair; seconded by Mr. Hicks. The motion was unanimously approved and Mr. Chamizo accepted the position.
- The Board agreed to set the meeting date/time and location as follows: the first Wednesday of month, 5:30 P.M. at the Coral Gables Library. There was discussion of recessing for the months of July and December, but specifics are to be determined.

Purpose and Responsibilities of the Waterway Advisory Board (WAB) – Ms. Keller summarized the purpose of the board related to key issue areas of maintenance, safety and recreation; discussed responsibility to report back to their respective appointer; mentioned that setting clear goals is important in order to be productive and bring about meaningful change; distributed a handout on the topic of sunshine law and mentioned that the City Attorney's office would provide a more in depth presentation of sunshine responsibilities at the next meeting.

Discussion of Board representation by Waterway Districts – this will be discussed in more detail at the next meeting.

Discussion of Priorities – Mr. Galan initiated the discussion in terms of topics – safety, liability, invasive species, infrastructure and sea level rise; Mr. Hicks inquired about the maintenance and code enforcement programs for the waterway, and mentioned the importance of the waterway as a community asset; Sergeant Hoff described the code enforcement process between Marine Patrol and Development Services; Mr. Acevedo discussed general city maintenance responsibilities (e.g. seaweed removal).

Mr. Yoder and Ms. Roberts initiated discussion of private property lines and waterway right-ofway in terms of how to determine maintenance responsibilities. Sergeant Hoff mentioned it could be a property to property decision, based on how the property was platted. Mr. Acevedo indicated in cases where a tree or other obstruction is a safety hazard or impeding navigability, the City will abate the situation.

Members and staff engaged in general discussion of water quality issues and concerns – dredging, discharges into the waterway, water quality analysis in terms of chemicals/minerals in the water; recommendation/inquiry into what studies or analyses have been done or should be done.

Mr. Chamizo suggested members provide their top 5 priorities to staff to compile for further discussion and prioritization (see attached memo).

Marine Patrol Discussion and Issues – Sergeant Hoff and members discussed a range of issues and questions:

- Fishing prohibited from bridges; allowed from banks e.g. under LeJeune Road bridge
- Signage review related to education, recreational safety, waterway guidelines, culverts (label, paint, signs); Sgt. Hoff mentioned intention to replace all permitted signage throughout the waterway; Mr. Acevedo mentioned ongoing program to replace channel markers.

- Code Enforcement coordination between PD and Development Services
- Crime watch Sgt. Hoff raised the point of using the WAB to improve communications in case of emergencies; community outreach in hurricane season. Members discussed developing a newsletter.
- Non-resident boats on waterway in hurricane season Ms. Roberts raised the concern about non-resident boats getting loose and causing damage to resident boats or property. Discussion ensued about safe harbor guidelines, tie down/anchor areas, and importance of keeping waterways navigable and free of obstructions.
- Safety rules for watercraft and paddleboards Sergeant Hoff stressed the need to be realistic in our focus important to balance education and enforcement, with emphasis on education at first.
