Autism in Florida

An estimated **59,656 children** with autism reside in the state of Florida.

An estimated

500,000 youth

with autism nationwide will enter adulthood over the next decade and most will continue to need some type of services or supports.

Many young adults with autism face a

"service cliff"

on the last day of high school when special education ends and access to needed supports and services drops off dramatically.

More than one-third

of young adults with autism do not transition into either employment or continued education after high school although many are willing and able to work.

of people with autism who received Florida Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) services are employed

HOME & COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES

21,555 people with developmental disabilities are waiting for Home and Community-Based Services
