 - a. Install CCTV Cameras on Waterways.
 - b. Add additional "NO FISHING" Signage on City's Bridges.
 - c. Install signs on City's waterways with a Phone Number to report any incident.
 - d. Requested damage assessment of all canals to identify any post Hurricane Irma damages such as:
 - o Dredging
 - o Accessibility
 - o Remove Debris
 - Remove damaged docks, piles, posts.

A motion was made to, "Request the installation of CCTV Cameras on Waterways, to add *NO FISHING* signs on the bridges, install signs on the waterways with a phone number to report any incident and to request that the City assess and identify the post Hurricane Irma damage to all canals."
