The following represents a summary of the items discussed during the Committee meeting.

### -MEETING AGENDA -

#### I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 8:30am.

#### II. ROLL CALL AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Theresa and Aileen were absent. All other members were in attendance and a quorum was present. Ariel made a motion to approve the November meeting minutes, the motion was seconded by Mary and passed unanimously.

#### III. NEW BUSINESS

- a. Charter School Policy & Practice Review
  - MDCPS has 125 Charter Schools, very friendly to Charters. There are 4-5 district managed schools. The District only manages the "back end" they do not do the hiring.
  - The only true municipal Charters are in Aventura, Miami Shores and Hialeah.
  - o Mayor discussed "hidden tax" of private school education.
    - Very unhappy with physical condition of Coral Gables Senior High.
    - Unhappy with craft section kids going to Tucker.
    - Unhappy with 16% of students going to West Lab and difficulty of purchasing seats.
  - GOB Project at CGSH is back in design phase to figure out how to spend \$11 million. Sam reiterates request for a town hall meeting and better communication from District to stakeholders.
  - Academica discusses its process- takes 1 ½ year to open a charter school.
    Needs approval by MDCPS. Non-profit governing board has to approach Academica as first step. Finding a suitable facility is often a challenge.
  - Somerset, which is operated by Academica, has been in Coral Gables since 2010 and has a certificate of use capped at 260. They are a K-5 and an A school, STEM designated. Percentage of residents and siblings is very high.
  - Representative Rojas discusses meeting that was had with Principal Costa, Region, Sam, etc. regarding CGSH marketing efforts and spreading the good word about the school, showcasing talent programs.
  - PTSA emphasizes the issue is not the quality of education it's the condition of the facility "perception is reality".
  - Should city avail itself of charter school option? Carmen frames discussion.
  - Usually municipalities will contract with a management company to run charter, but in some cases a municipality will run the school. Having a School District serve as the management company is also an option.

- Charters have to be county-wide unless they are municipal charters. They <u>can</u> have geographic preferences.
- o Sam says members should brief their commissioners on this conversation.

## IV. ONGING BUSINESS

- a. Commission update on School Improvement Projects
  - o SCRC is on board with presenting an update to the City Commission for first meeting in January.
