

Beautification of Granada & Columbus Circles

Description:


These plazas will be reconfigured to better channel vehicular traffic and protect pedestrian travel while preserving the historic integrity of the space. The project will improve the pedestrian experience by providing additional mobility options to the community and celebrating the beauty of the plazas planned by George Merrick.

Concepts developed as part of the Multimodal Transportation Planning Process. Upon plan adoption, design will commence. Funding for the construction of the improvements will be addressed during the FY 2019 budget process.

Country Club Prado Landscaping Improvements

Description:

The landscape improvements included the planting of over 200 trees and palms and included eight varieties of flowering tree species and a number of unique character trees such as Kapok and native Ficus trees. Over 80 native Dade County Pines were planted, mostly in a large native Pine Rocklands area planted on the north end of Country Club Prado to mimic the original native habitat of the area. New purple and magenta flowering Bougainvillea vines were planted along the historic trellis columns to restore the original planting design. Landscaping was planted along Red Road and behind the Coral Gables entrance signs to enhance the aesthetics along the City's prominent western entrance points.

Segovia Circles Civic Monuments

Description:

Passion/Passiflora Incarnation

The first major public artwork since Coral Gables founder George Merrick's day. The two sculptures depicting passion flowers — which celebrate Coral Gables roots as a Garden City — grace the Segovia Circle roundabouts at Coral Way and Biltmore Way.

Beautification of Street Intersections

Description:

A number of street intersections in the City were unnecessarily wide. The excessive width encouraged vehicular speeding, thereby making pedestrian mobility difficult and unsafe. Beautification and restructuring of street triangle intersections at Manati Ave. and Hardee Rd, Campo Sano Ave. and University Dr., Valencia Ave. and Cardena St., and San Amaro Ct. and San Amaro Dr. slowed vehicular traffic, enhanced pedestrian mobility and provided additional trees and green space to cool neighborhoods and better channel storm water runoff.

City-wide Landscaping Improvements

Description:

The NRP funded City-wide landscaping project started in 2011 and was the precursor to the City funded Tree Succession project that started in 2015. Highlights included planting Heirloom New Medjool Date Palms along the Ponce de Leon median from Almeria to Salamanca Avenues with coordinating Alexander Palms and Green Island Ficus in the sidewalk planters along the same stretch of road; as well as planting Solitaire Palms, Green Island Ficus and colorful accent plants and installing irrigation on the Le Jeune median from Altara to Mendoza Avenues.

Project Status:

Though the original NRP portion of the project is complete, the FY18 budget allocated \$150,000 of investment interest generated by the NRP funds to the Tree Succession project.



Entrances & Fountains Restoration

Description:

This project includes the renovation of entrance features and fountains at various historic plazas including the Granada Plaza, Granada Entrance, Balboa Plaza, Segovia Plaza, Commercial Entrance, Ponce de Leon and Columbus Plazas. The improvements include architectural & structural renovation, conservation of the historical structures, mechanical, electrical, lighting and landscaping works.

William H. Kerdyk/Biltmore Tennis Center

Description:

A complete renovation of the premier public hard court tennis facility in Coral Gables. Phase I renovations included: resurfacing the hard courts, installing a new court lighting system, replacing fencing on court perimeters, installing new signage, and renovating the parking, facility entrance and patio areas. Phase II is a complete renovation of the pro shop facility to include: relocating and expanding the pro shop area to the first floor, expanding outdoor shaded seating, rest room facilities and storage areas, renovating entrances, and adding a new activity room and a new office.

De Soto Fountain Traffic Circle Improvements

Description:

This traffic circle will be reconfigured to better channel vehicular traffic, provide sidewalks and incorporate bicycle infrastructure while preserving the historic integrity of the central fountain. The project will increase the greenspace, thereby cooling the neighborhood and better treating storm water runoff.

Development of Passive Parks

Description:

Maggiore Park at 5208 Maggiore St. is a half acre lot that will be improved with additional landscaping, renovations to walkways and new park amenities.

Betsy Adams and the Coral Gables Garden Club Park is a half acre lot at 4650 Alhambra Circle that will be named in honor of resident Betsy Adams and her work with the Coral Gables Garden Club. Improvements include additional landscaping, a new perimeter walkway, and a new playground area.


Cepero Park, (San Amaro Triangle) at 4600 San Amaro Drive will be renamed in honor of resident Enrique "Henry" Cepero and completed in two phases. Phase I (completed) included new landscaping, trees, irrigation and improved pedestrian access. Phase two will include a trellis and commemorating plaque officially renaming the park.

NRP component substantially complete. The City Commission is committed to the expansion and enhancement of the City's Parks system. The City's General Capital Improvement Fund annually allocates \$300,000 for the future purchase of new park land. Including the Fiscal Year 2018 \$300,000 allocation, the current reserve is \$1,800,000.



Lot 25 Park Development

Description:

This project will transform the existing City parking lot 25 located at the intersection of Giralda Avenue and Merrick Way into a beautiful and inviting public space. The project will include new paving materials, landscaping, hardscape furniture and seating areas, as well as lighting.

Youth Center Improvements – Phase1

Description:

Phase 1 of the Youth Center improvements included replacement of the perimeter chain-link fence and back stops; rehabilitation of the basketball courts including court resurfacing/restriping and the replacement of the backboards, rims, and nets; repair/replacement of the steel picket fence; pressure washing and painting of the dugout areas and also replacement of the dugout canopy; stucco repair at bleachers and dugout areas; concrete sealers applied to floor areas; and the replacement of eight steel entrance gates and twelve steel grilles with aluminum.

Installation of Bicycle Infrastructure

Description:

Installation of bicycle infrastructure citywide. Among the improvements is the creation of the Gables Greenways - safe, accessible bike infrastructure for commuters and people of all ages and abilities. In 2014, the City Commission adopted the publicly vetted City of Coral Gables' Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan. The "Plan" proposes more than 27 miles of new or improved bikeways. It recommends a comprehensive expansion of bike infrastructure that will appeal to all types of users.

Adult Activity Center

Description:


Lease and development of space at Palace Garage for use as an Adult Activity Center. Build out of the 9,700 square foot space included one large meeting room space, three classrooms, media room, conference room, registration offices and rest rooms. Design of these spaces with new furnishings, included furniture for lobbies, offices, activity rooms and reception desk areas. New kitchen and bathroom furnishings installed, tile flooring, LED lighting, Camera surveillance system and state of the art Audio Visual system.

Park Furnishings

Description:

The City purchased over 100 park furnishings to replace the worn furnishings in neighborhood Parks including Phillips Park, Jaycee Park, Coral Bay Park, Sunrise Harbor Park, Salvadore Park, Fred B. Hartnett Ponce Circle Park, and Pierce Park. Furnishings at the Biltmore Tennis Center and the War Memorial Youth Center were also addressed. New furnishings included trash receptacles, park benches and picnic tables. All furnishings were the City design standard of Ipe wood with metal framing which gives a natural aesthetic to the City parks and facilities.

Fitness Trail Equipment

Description:
