Mayor Valdes-Fauli: And now we have my comments. My comments are going to be very brief today. I also have a report on the World Happiness Summit, which took place last week here. The opening ceremony was at Venetian Pool and it was a beautiful day, the Venetian Pool was beautiful. I met very many interesting people. In spite of their name, the World Happiness Summit, it was a very serious summit with ministers of economics from various countries, professors of sociology,

psychology, economics, political science, etc., from various universities – Penn, Harvard, Michigan, etc.; and the next day, Friday, the event took place at the University of Miami at the Shalala Center. There were concerns raised about it, but this year they said because of the redesign and the width of the sidewalks and the curb less sidewalks and everything else, it really made for a good venue for everyone.

Mayor Valdes-Fauli: I'm glad that you got those comments because the sidewalks were – there were a lot of people there, but there were tables outside, the people were enjoying the restaurants, etc., and then the big traffic was in the center lane; the center lanes were the booths were.
