SUBJECT: Formal Protest -AshBritt, Inc. – RFP 2018-009 (Disaster Debris Removal Services)

I. Introduction

Ashbritt, Inc. ("Ashbritt") filed a notice and letter protesting the City Manager's recommendation to the City Commission that the Disaster Debris Removal Services RFP 2018-009 (the "RFP") be awarded to Ashbritt as the tertiary provider. Accordingly, under City Code § 2-910(g), this Procurement Officer, after consultation with the City Attorney, recommends the denial of Ashbritt's protest.

II. Background

The City of Coral Gables (the "City") solicited the RFP to contract qualified and experienced professional firms to provide disaster debris removal services. On March 6, 2018, the City Procurement Division formally advertised, issued, and distributed the RFP. On April 25, 2018, the Evaluation Committee (the "EC") convened in a public meeting to evaluate eight responsive proposals and recommended that the City negotiate contracts with the three highest ranked responsive-responsible proposers in rank order—Phillips and Jordan, Inc. ("Phillips") as the primary provider, Ceres Environmental Services, Inc. ("Ceres") as the secondary provider, and Ashbritt as the tertiary provider (Comp. & Individual Score Sheets, Comp. Ex. 1).

On May 1, 2018, the City Manager issued a formal recommendation outlining the award of the RFP in accordance with the EC's evaluation and recommendation. All parties were notified.

On May 4 and 9, 2018, Ashbritt filed its notice and letter, respectively, protesting its ranking as the tertiary provider.

II. <u>Responses to Ashbritt's Claims</u>

Ashbritt's protest should be rejected as it cannot show illegality, fraud, or oppression, much less arbitrary or capricious misconduct. See Miami-Dade County v. Church & Tower, 715 So. 2d 1084, 1085-90 (Fla. 3d DCA 1998) (citing Dep't of Transp. v. Groves-Watkins Constructors, 530 So. 2d 912 (Fla. 1988); Liberty County v. Baxter's Asphalt & Concrete, Inc., 421 So. 2d 505 (Fla. 1982)). Florida law recognizes that the City has wide discretion in soliciting and accepting bids, and its decision, when based on an honest exercise of this discretion, will not be overturned even if it may appear erroneous and even if reasonable persons may disagree. Id. Furthermore, the City is entitled to wide deference with respect to the administrative construction of its own rules and requirements and should not be overturned unless clearly erroneous. See Pan American World Airways, Inc. v. Fla. Public Service Comm., 427 So. 2d 716, 719 (Fla. 1983); State Contracting and Eng'g Corp. v. Dep't of Transp., 709 So. 2d 607 (Fla. 1st DCA 1988). Consequently, Ashbritt's protest should be rejected.

Protest Claim No. 1-the City did not properly appoint the EC members:

Ashbritt claims that the City did not properly appoint the EC because: (1) the City personnel involved did not have authority to appoint EC members; and (2) EC member Wade Sanders was not properly substituted for a resigning member.

Response:

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Contrary to Ashbritt's assertions, the undersigned (Celeste Walker) was appointed as the City's Procurement Officer on August 24, 2017 (Appointment Memo., Ex. 2) and had the authority to appoint EC members. City Code §§ 2-496, 585, 586. Diane Gomez, the City's Director of Finance, was not involved in the appointment of the EC as she is not the Procurement Officer.

The undersigned, as admitted by Ashbritt, approved the appointment of the original EC members on March 22, 2018 via written email (Ex. 3). After Carlos Arroyo agreed to be a substitute on the EC via email (Ex. 4 (email copied the undersigned)), on April 18, 2018, the undersigned verbally approved Arroyo's EC appointment in conversation with Yusbel Gonzalez, the Procurement Specialist. Likewise, on April 18, 2018, the undersigned verbally approved the EC substitution of Wade Sanders in a conversation with Gonzalez. Gonzalez did not select any EC members and acted, at all material times, at the direction of the undersigned Procurement Officer. In fact, the two substituted EC members had already been identified as potential EC members as they have knowledge in the subject area of debris removal. Additionally, the City delivered the RFP evaluation materials to the substitute and original EC members (*see* email chain to EC, Ex. 5). Thus, Ashbritt's claim that the EC members were not properly appointed by the Procurement Officer is factually erroneous and controverted. Moreover, Ashbritt fails to demonstrate any violation of law, as much of the procurement business is done verbally and no requirement that appointment of EC members be done in writing exists.

Protest Claim No. 2-the EC had insufficient disaster waste remediation experience in the City:

Ashbritt complains that: (1) the City did not identify the EC members in its notice of the public meeting scheduled for April 25, 2018; (2) the EC was inappropriately constituted because only one member with experience in the subject matter of solid waste management and disaster remediation was a City employee; and (3) EC member, Thomas Norman, was unqualified to serve as a member because he did not have knowledge of the subject matter or of governmental procurement standards.

Response:

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First, there is no requirement that the City identify the EC members prior to the public meeting.

Second, the City has discretion to appoint EC members and there is no requirement that the City appoint an EC with members experienced in the subject matter of the RFP, who work for the City, or who even live in the City. Despite the lack of any related requirement, in its selection of EC members, the City endeavors to select persons with varied knowledge and experience, including persons who work in the private sector, for the City or other governmental entities, or who live in the City. In this instance, the EC members had knowledge of disaster remediation (*see* EC members' background chart, Ex. 6). Also, the EC members lived in the community, worked for the City, sister governmental entities, or had related private sector experience.

As an example, although not required, Norman has relevant experience valuable to the EC during the proposal evaluation. Norman is a retired Florida Power and Light ("FPL") employee who served as a liaison to the City and was active and stationed with City staff in the Emergency Operations Center through the duration of a Category 5 hurricane.

As a result, Ashbritt's factual arguments are erroneous. Moreover, Ashbritt's alleged deficiencies, even if true, cannot establish any illegality.

Protest Claim No. 3-the City's ratings guidelines are inconsistent with the solicitation:

Ashbritt claims that the City's RFP solicitation should have notified it of the scoring factors and ranges set forth in the ratings guidelines that were provided to the EC. Ashbritt also argues that while the solicitation required evaluation at the conclusion of the EC meeting, in accordance with the instruction sheet provided to EC members, Norman pre-scored his score sheet prior to the meeting. On the basis of the foregoing, Ashbritt argues that the ratings guidelines and instruction sheet provided to the EC members contradicts the RFP solicitation, and allowed for the EC members' violation of the terms of the solicitation.

Response:

Ashbritt again fails to demonstrate that the City violated any rule or how the City treated it differently than the other potential proposers.

First, no inconsistency exists between the RFP solicitation and the ratings guidelines. The RFP solicitation outlines for potential proposers the evaluation criteria/categories and the maximum points assigned to each one of the categories (RFP Solicitation, § 7.3, Ex. 7). In conformity with the solicitation, the City provides the EC members, who actually evaluate and score the proposers, the ratings guidelines (Ex. 8) to assist them with the scoring and rating of the proposers. As admitted by Ashbritt, the ratings guidelines mirror the categories and baseline of

maximum points set forth in § 7.3 of the RFP solicitation. Additionally, the ratings guidelines are advisory and do not require any particular scoring and rating by EC members. Moreover, this process is standard and in conformity with the formalized procurement process used by the City and countless other governmental entities throughout the County. Therefore, the guidelines are in no way inconsistent with the RFP solicitation, and again, Ashbritt fails to demonstrate how any EC members violated the terms of the solicitation.

Second, no inconsistency exists between the RFP solicitation (§ 7.2) and the instructions sheet (Ex. 9) provided to the EC members. The instructions only reference the evaluators' initial/preliminary scoring—it only requests that the evaluators review proposers' packages so that they can make their "initial" evaluation/scoring in pencil. Nowhere do the instructions indicate that this initial review conducted by each evaluator alone will be final or determinative. To the contrary, the instructions state that the evaluators will have the opportunity to ask questions during the evaluation session where they can change and finalize their scores. It is a customary practice employed throughout County governmental entities to provide the EC the proposals in advance of the public meeting to allow the members the opportunity to review and familiarize themselves with the materials so that an informed discussion can take place during the evaluation session. And although Ashbritt alludes to the potential for outside influence during the EC members' independent preliminary review, it points to no evidence of outside influence on the members' final scoring during a public meeting.

The EC members provided their final scores at an audio/video recorded publicly-noticed meeting. Therefore, Ashbritt again fails to indicate how this process violated any law (including the Sunshine Law) or solely prejudiced it to the exclusion of other proposers.

Protest Claim No. 4-EC member improperly considered litigation history in scoring Ashbritt:

Ashbritt claims that EC member Norman considered Ashbritt's litigation history when scoring the evaluation criteria in violation of the RFP solicitation. In support, Ashbritt points to Norman's opinion regarding its deficiency during the public meeting, his email inquiring about the litigation history of all eight proposers, and his scoring of 18 out of 30 points on Ashbritt's experience and qualifications.

Response:

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Ashbritt's claim that Norman considered litigation history in scoring the RFP solicitation categories is without merit.

Ashbritt cannot point to evidence that Norman considered litigation history in scoring the solicitation categories. Norman's comment regarding Ashbritt's extensive litigation history was met with an instruction that review of the litigation was a part of the responsibility review conducted by the Procurement Division. In addition, during the public meeting, Ashbritt was not the sole provider's litigation history that was discussed; other proposers' litigation history was discussed. Also, Norman's comments regarding litigation history were related to all proposers and in no manner singled out Ashbritt. Moreover, Norman's scoring of Ashbritt, a proposer with 25 years of disaster debris removal experience, is in conformity with Norman's experience and qualifications scoring for the primary and secondary proposers, which have 41 and 42 years of disaster debris removal experience, respectively.

As such, Ashbritt's protest argument is tantamount to asking the City to ignore the public meeting, Norman's good faith participation and evaluation (including his executed conflict waiver, *see infra.* at Ex. 10), and the City's direct instructions on the litigation history. The City cannot find that Norman disregarded Gonzalez's instructions and lowered Ashbritt's score in bad faith without an evidentiary basis. Ashbritt's speculative and conclusory allegations are illogical and insufficient to overcome Norman's, and the other proposers', good faith participation and scoring of Ashbritt, at a public meeting. Such decision would render the evaluation at the public meeting meaningless and prejudice the primary and secondary providers' bids without a basis. Therefore, the City should reject Ashbritt's claim.

<u>Protest Claims Nos. 5-6—EC member's Ashbritt scores were so low that his evaluation had to be</u> arbitrary, capricious, and biased:

Ashbritt claims that Norman's comments during the public meeting and scoring of Ashbritt was so inconsistent with the other EC members' scores that his evaluation had to be arbitrary, capricious, and biased.

Response:

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4. ...

Ashbritt's claim that Norman's scoring of Ashbritt was arbitrary, capricious, and biased, is again based on speculation, and thus, insufficient to show any illegality, or capricious and biased misconduct.

The evaluation process is designed to allow each EC member to make his or her personal assessments of the submitted proposals. EC members provide different perspectives during the evaluation process and the City benefits from that diversity of thought. For instance, Norman as a City resident and a member of the private sector may provide a perspective different from that of EC members in the public sector. Additionally, as part of the evaluation process, all committee members completed and executed a No-Conflict of Interest Certification (Ex. 10) in order to participate on the EC. The form requires that each EC member certify that they have no personal or financial conflicts of interest with the proposers prior to evaluation. Therefore, it is not reasonable to expect that all members will agree on the individual assessments of proposers or that the City should randomly discard a particular member's evaluation on the basis that his opinion was different than that of the other EC members.

More specifically, as stated above, during the public meeting it was noted that Ashbritt had approximately 25 years of relevant experience. However, the primary and secondary ranked proposers, Phillips and Ceres, both had 41 and 42 years of experience, respectively. In this respect, Ashbritt was the least experienced firm out of the top selected proposers. With respect to Norman's email (Ex. 11) inquiring about City references, Norman did not name any specific proposer. Norman's specific correspondence stated: "what was the contractor for Irma, and why didn't that firm request [that the City] provide a letter of recommendation? Would that have been inappropriate? If one of these Proposers was our last contractor, I would be interested to know if the City was satisfied with their work." Contrary to Ashbritt's argument, such email evinces that Norman took the evaluation seriously, did not know that Ashbritt was the City's disaster debris provider during the hurricane. Moreover, during the public meeting, EC member

Brook Dannemiller from the City Public Works Department stated that the City was pleased with the performance of the current contractor, Ashbritt.

Similarly, Norman's lower scores in comparison to the scores of other EC member does not prove bias toward Ashbritt. Analysis of Norman's scores reveals that they were lower for all proposers, and thus, indicative that his evaluation was consistent with his assessment and private sector perspective. The City should not second-guess his evaluation on the basis of his scores or Ashbritt's cherry-picking of Norman's comments during the course of an approximately two-and-a-half-hour public meeting.

As Ashbritt cannot show any illegality, much less capricious or biased misconduct, the City should reject Ashbritt's claim.

IV. Recommendation

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Based on a review of Ashbritt's protest, the undersigned found nothing improper about the procurement process, the evaluation of the proposers, or EC member Norman's conduct or evaluation. To the contrary, the EC members followed the proper procedures and the final decision was agreed upon by all members. It is unreasonable to discard the scores of one EC member simply because the result was not favorable to one proposer. Accordingly, the undersigned Procurement Officer recommends that the City reject the protest and adopt the EC's original recommendation to rank Ashbritt as the tertiary awarded proposer.

I am pleased to announce the appointment of Celeste S. Walker as the new Assistant Finance Director for Procurement, effective Monday, August 28, 2017. Ms. Walker will assume the role of Procurement Officer (formerly known as Chief Procurement Officer) and be responsible for managing the day-to-day operations of the Procurement Division in the Finance Department. In this role, Ms. Walker will administer the City's purchasing ordinance to ensure citywide compliance as well as develop and implement innovative purchasing solutions to meet the needs of our city. This will include managing the re-write of our Procurement Code to focus on best practices, timeliness, and efficient customer focused processes. Ms. Walker will also oversee the preparation, administration and monitoring of contracts citywide.

Ms. Walker received her Master's in Business Administration from Webster University. She is a Certified Public Procurement Officer (CPPO) and a Certified Professional in Supply Management (CPSM) with over 23 years of government procurement experience.
