- (a) Violations of this section shall be punishable as provided in section 1-7.
- (b) It shall be unlawful for any person to do work on or cut into, dig up, or excavate for the purpose of laying sewers, water mains, underground wires, or gas pipes, or for setting poles, or any other purpose whatsoever, any of the streets, parks, parkways, sidewalks, alleys, or easements in the city without first securing from the director of public works a permit to do such work, and make such excavations.

Sec. 109-40. - Required; classes.

- (a) *Penalty.* Violations of this section shall be punishable as provided in section 1-7.
- (b) General. No work shall be performed in, upon, or contiguous to any water area within the city, until and unless a subdivision plat shall have been approved and recorded in the manner prescribed by the subdivision ordinance of the city, platting or replatting such land into lots or parcels for building development and a permit authorizing such work has been obtained in the manner prescribed herein. All work to be done under a permit issued by the city must conform to the city public works department standards. The standards of the public works department shall be designed to promote public peace, public safety and protect the environment.
- (c) Categories of permits. Permits required by this article shall be divided into three major categories as follows:
 - (1) Class 1. Permits for dredging or filling of submerged lands and tidal lands in coastal and intercoastal waters including areas of environmental significance as defined in the Rules of the State of Florida Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund, within the municipal limits of the city and under the jurisdiction of the trustees of the internal improvement fund and/or the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.
 - (2) Class 2. Permits for constructing bulkheads, seawalls, groins, breakwaters, wharves, docks, piers, structures and shore activities such as, but not limited to, beach nourishment in, upon or contiguous to submerged lands or tidal lands within the municipal limits of the city and under the jurisdiction of the trustees of the internal improvement fund and/or the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.
 - (3) Class 3. Permits for excavating or filling, or constructing bulkheads, docks, piers, boat slips and similar structures in, upon or contiguous to bays, lakes, canals and other water areas under the direct control of the city by virtue of ownership, dedication by plat, easement, reservation or right-of-way and access agreement or instrument.
