We 3 do need to do a couple things before we actually start the meetings. We are without a chair and a vice chair, so 4 5 actually you can confirm if I'm doing this correctly. We have no chair and vice chair currently because they were 6 7 both termed off, and I need to re-appoint the 8 board-as-a-whole appointee, so I'm going to do that first. Is that okay? 9 That's perfectly fine. 10 MR. CEBALLOS: THE COURT REPORTER: You want to be on the 11 12 record for this? 13 MS. KAUTZ: Yes. 14 THE COURT REPORTER: Yes, yes, I am on the 15 record. Thank you. 16 MS. KAUTZ: So what needs to happen is John 17 Fullerton is our board-as-a-whole appointee, so I need a motion to accept him for another two-year term if that is 18 what the board desires. 19 MR. FULLERTON: Why don't we vote on the 20 21 chairman first? 22 MR. MENENDEZ: No. 23 MS. KAUTZ: Sneaky boy. I see where you're 24 going with this but first we have to have the full vote, 25 so any motion?

Page 3 1 MR. RODRIGUEZ: I'm sorry, I missed it. I 2 was --3 MS. KAUTZ: Our board-as-a-whole appointee 4 needs to vote on the appointee to be reappointed for another two-year term. 5 6 MR. Now, 2 there is your script, and we'll give you a moment if you 3 want to familiarize yourself with it. 4 MR. EHRENHAFT: Okay, okay. Good afternoon. 5 It is 4:07 p.m. on December 17th. THE COURT REPORTER: No. 6 7 MR. RODRIGUEZ: December? 8 MR. EHRENHAFT: I'm sorry. Excuse me. 9 MS. THOMSON: Good job. MR. EHRENHAFT: Excuse me, June 20th, 2019, 10 and we're calling the meeting of the Coral Gables Historic 11 12 Preservation Board to order. 13 Welcome to the regularly-scheduled meeting of 14 the City of Coral Gables Historic Preservation Board. We 15 are residents of Coral Gables and are charged with preservation and protection of historic or architecturally 16 17 worthy buildings, structures, sites, neighborhoods and artifacts which impact and impart a distinct historical 18 heritage of the city. 19 The board is comprised of nine members, seven 20 21 of whom are appointed by the commission, one by the city manager, and the ninth is selected by the board and 22 confirmed by the commission. Five members of the board 23 constitute a quorum, and five affirmative votes are 24 25 necessary for the adoption of any motion.

1 Lobbyist registration and disclosure: Any 2 person who acts as a lobbyist pursuant to the City of 3 Coral Gables Ordinance Number 2006-11 must register with the city clerk prior to engaging in lobbying activities or 4 presentations before the city staff, boards, committees 5 and/or the city commission. A copy of the ordinance is б 7 available in the city, office of the city clerk, and 8 failure to register and provide proof of registration shall provide -- shall prohibit you from your ability to 9 present to the Historic Preservation Board on applications 10 under consideration this afternoon. 11 12 Lobbyist is defined as an individual, 13 corporation, partnership or other legal entity employed or 14 retained, whether paid or not, by a principal who seeks to 15 encourage the approval, disapproval, adoption, repeal, 16 passage, defeat, or modifications of, A, any ordinance, 17 resolution, action, or decision of any city commissioner. B, any action, decision, recommendation of 18 19 the city manager, any city board or committee, including, but not limited, to quasi-judicial advisory board, trust, 20 21 authority or council. 22 Or C, any action, decision or recommendation of the city personnel during the time period of the entire 23 decision making process on the action, decision, or 24 25 recommendation which foreseeably will be heard or reviewed

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Page 8 by the city commission or a city board or committee, 1 2 including, but not limited to, guasi-judicial, 3 quasi-judicial advisory board, trust, authority or council. 4 Presentations made to this board are subject 5 to the city's false claims ordinance, Chapter 23 of the 6 7 City of Coral Gables city code. 8 I now officially call the City of Coral Gables Historic Preservation meeting of June 20, 2019 to 9 order. The time is 4:10 p.m. 10 11 Present today are the members of the board, staff and distinguished persons. To my right, Alicia 12 13 Bach-Wiig; to my right, John Fullerton; Cesar Pons, Cesar Garcia-Pons; Xavier Durana. 14 And to my left, Albert Menendez; Raul 15 Rodriguez; Mike Sardinas; and Jan Thomson. 16 17 Approvals of the minutes. The next item on the agenda is approval of the minutes of the meeting held 18 19 on -- I'm sorry, I don't remember the date of the last I have to look. Kara, could you remind me of 20 meeting. the date of the last meeting? 21 22 MS. KAUTZ: May --23 MR. CEBALLOS: May 16th. 24 MS. KAUTZ: -- 16th. 25 May 16th, okay. So is there MR. EHRENHAFT:

Page 9 a motion for approval of the minutes from the last 1 2 meeting? 3 MR. MENENDEZ: I so move. 4 MR. EHRENHAFT: Okay. Is there a second? 5 MS. BACH-WIIG: Second. MR. EHRENHAFT: Okay. Jessie, you should б 7 have interrupted me. I'm sorry. 8 THE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT: Mr. Sardinas? MR. SARDINAS: I will abstain. I did not 9 read them. 10 11 THE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT: Mr. Menendez? 12 MR. MENENDEZ: Yes. 13 THE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT: Mr. Rodriguez? 14 MR. RODRIGUEZ: Yes. 15 THE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT: Miss Thomson? 16 MS. THOMSON: I abstain. I didn't read them. 17 THE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT: Mr. Fullerton? MR. FULLERTON: Yes. 18 19 THE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT: Miss Bach-Wiig? 20 21 MS. BACH-WIIG: Yes. 22 MS. KAUTZ: You weren't here. 23 THE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT: 24 Mr. Garcia-Pons? 25 MR. GARCIA-PONS: Abstain. I wasn't present.

Page 11 1 THE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT: Mr. Durana? 2 MR. DURANA: Abstain. I wasn't present. 3 THE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT: Mr. Ehrenhaft? 4 MR. EHRENHAFT: Yes. MR. RODRIGUEZ: Do we have five votes? 5 MR. MENENDEZ: We should have five votes. 6 7 MS. KAUTZ: One, two, three, four, five. That should be five. 8 MS. THOMSON: That was the day I broke my 9 foot. 10 Okay, all right. 11 MS. KAUTZ: 12 MR. EHRENHAFT: Okay. So notice regarding ex parte communications. Please be advised that this board 13 14 is a quasi-judicial board and the items on the agenda are 15 quasi-judicial in nature which requires board members to 16 disclose all ex parte communications. 17 An ex parte communication is defined as any contact, communication, conversation, correspondence, 18 memorandum or other written or verbal communication that 19 takes place outside of the public hearing between a member 20 21 of the public and a member of the quasi-judicial board 22 regarding matters to be heard by the quasi-judicial board. 23 If anyone has made any contact with a board 24 member, when the issue comes before the board, the member 25 must state on the record the existence of the ex parte

Page 12 communication, the party who the communication was had 1 2 with, and whether the communication will affect the board 3 member's ability to impartially consider the evidence to 4 be presented regarding the matter. 5 Has anybody had such ex parte communications regarding any item on the agenda today? б 7 MR. FULLERTON: Mr. Chairman, other than driving by the sites as we talked last week -- last month, 8 we have to report that too? It's kind of -- yes, I went 9 by and I looked at the site. 10 11 MS. KAUTZ: Of both of them? 12 MR. FULLERTON: Of both of them, yes. 13 MR. RODRIGUEZ: As did I. 14 Okay. Can you explain to the MS. KAUTZ: 15 board, new board members about that as well? 16 MS. THOMSON: Yes, please. That was 17 different. MR. CEBALLOS: Ex parte communications are 18 typically any sort of information that you went outside 19 the scope of this meetings on any of the items that were 20 21 presented to you that are part of the record, so meaning if there's an item coming before the board and you have 22 either spoken with the applicant, the resident, the 23 24 homeowner or the contractor, whoever it may be, any sort 25 of information you've been provided outside the scope of

Page 13 this meeting, when the item comes up -- typically we won't 1 2 do them at the beginning, just, it's kind of broad. 3 You know, as each item comes up, you'll 4 declare any sort of ex parte communications, particularly, 5 like I said, if you have spoken to anyone. You don't need to go into details, just a general idea of what the б 7 conversation was about. 8 If there was a conversation, at the end of the day, as long as you can still become -- provide a 9 reasonable -- the language escapes me at this current 10 moment, but as long as you can -- you're not being swayed 11 12 by that language, as long you're only looking at the items 13 that are presented before you today, and you can still 14 make that vote, then you have no issues voting. 15 Additionally, if you've gone to the site and 16 you've done a site visit, that's information that you went 17 and gathered on your own, and once again, if you can, when each item is called up, if you do have any of those things 18 to declare, please declare them. 19 MS. THOMSON: So site visits are considered 20 21 ex parte? I know that came up. 22 MR. CEBALLOS: Ex parte communications, ex parte communications, not exactly, but because that is an 23 item that you've gone outside the scope of this board to 24 25 gather further information that would kind of lead to your

Page 14 1 decision today, we would like you to declare it. 2 MS. THOMSON: Okay. 3 MR. CEBALLOS: They're not treated in the exact same fashion as ex parte, but they're close enough 4 where we'd like you to declare them in an abundance of 5 6 caution. 7 MS. KAUTZ: Thank you. 8 MR. EHRENHAFT: Okay. So apart from the visitations then that have been declared, there were no 9 other ex parte communications? 10 11 MR. RODRIGUEZ: I visited the sites, both of 12 them. 13 MR. EHRENHAFT: Yes. 14 MR. RODRIGUEZ: But other than that, no. 15 MR. EHRENHAFT: Okay. 16 MS. THOMSON: No. 17 MS. BACH-WIIG: And I also visited both 18 sites. 19 MS. KAUTZ: Okay. 20 MS. BACH-WIIG: But we're supposed to say that before each item? 21 22 MR. GUS: Verbally when each item is called, 23 you would declare it at that moment. 24 MR. EHRENHAFT: Okay. 25 MS. KAUTZ: There's only one on the agenda

It's a report 15 of the City of Coral Galbes Historic, Historical Resources 16 Department to the Historic Preservation Board on the ad 17 valorem tax exemption request for the improvements to the property at 414 Alhambra Circle, Coral Gables, Florida, a 18 contributing resource within the Alhambra Circle Historic 19 20 District. 21 MR. MENENDEZ: You have to swear in the 22 public. 23 MS. KAUTZ: Yes. They changed the titles. 24 Okay. 25 MR. EHRENHAFT: Yes, I know, but I thought I

So if there are 15 persons in the audience who will be testifying today, 16 please rise to be sworn in. 17 THE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT: Please raise your right hand. Do you swear to tell the truth, the 18 whole truth and nothing but the truth? 19 THE MEMBERS OF THE AUDIENCE: 20 I do 21 (collectively). 22 THE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT: Thank you. 23 MS. KAUTZ: Okay. Put the first item left up 24 on the Power Point, please. So I can read it. This is 25 what you're supposed to read, but I can do it if you want.

Page 17 1 MR. EHRENHAFT: Oh, I'm sorry. 2 MS. KAUTZ: That's okay. 3 MR. EHRENHAFT: Okay, okay. So this is Case 4 File AV 2016-003, application requesting ad valorem tax 5 relief for the property at 414 Alhambra Circle, a contributing resource within the Alhambra Circle Historic 6 7 District, legally described as Lots Eight and Nine, Block 8 Six, Coral Gables Section B, according to the plat thereof, as recorded in Plat Book Five at Page 11 of the 9 public records of Miami-Dade County, Florida. 10 11 The related Special Certificate of 12 Appropriateness, COA (ST) 2015-017, was granted design 13 approval by the Historic Preservation Board on December 17, 2015. 14 15 THE COURT REPORTER: Page, Page 111. He said 16 Page 11. It's Page 111. 17 MS. KAUTZ: Yes. 18 MR. EHRENHAFT: Page 111. Sorry. Thank you. 19 MS. KAUTZ: So for any of our board members and anyone who might be watching this, historically 20 21 designated properties and those within the historic districts are eligible for an ad valorem tax relief 22 program that's administered by the city and the county 23 24 that basically gives you a tax abatement for ten years on 25 the increased value of your property due to improvements

Page 18 and restoration work, so this was a property that took 1 2 advantage of that particular tax exemption. 3 It's a contributing structure within the Alhambra Circle Historic District. That's the location 4 5 map. It's just off of Le Jeune, between Le Jeune and Hernando on Alhambra. б 7 This is a photograph of the house in the 8 1940s. It was permitted in 1924, Permit 1276, within the city. It was designed in the Mediterranean Revival style 9 by the team of Frank Wyatt Woods and John Tracey. 10 It was, had minor alterations to it and was added onto in 1951 to 11 12 the rear. 13 There was an auxiliary garage structure to 14 the southwest corner of the property that had been 15 substantially altered in 1953. 16 But overall the property did contribute and still continues to the architectural fabric of the city. 17 18 So this is how the property looked as of 19 yesterday with the addition to what's right, the right side on your screen. This was approved, work for an 20 21 addition, alterations to the property was approved in 22 2015, so some of you might have seen this. 23 And so I'll go through the list of 24 improvements. These are the before and after pictures 25 that I'm going to show you on the screen. The property

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1 was in need of some TLC when it came to us. 2 So general restoration work, new 3 impact-resistant casement windows to match the original configuration, new barrel tile roof, new house -- they 4 painted the entire house, new mechanical, electrical and 5 plumbing systems, the demolition of the utility room б 7 addition to the rear, extensive interior work that 8 included the restoration of the original oak pine floors, refinishing of the fireplace mantel, interior 9 configuration, and restoration of the pecky cypress 10 ceilings in the entry and the living room. 11 12 The addition consists of a one-story great 13 room and a two-story portion with a garage that was to the 14 west of the original house, the garage, laundry room, 15 powder room, AC closet, covered terrace on the first 16 floor, and a guest bedroom with open terrace on the second 17 floor. This is the garage to the bottom left. 18 Ιt was allowed to be demolished because it had been 19 substantially altered and was in disrepair, so it was 20 21 replaced with a new garage. Site improvements include the installation of 22 a new brick paver driveway and walkways, a new swimming 23 24 pool and deck and new landscaping. 25 So you all were given the Part One and Part

Page 20 Two application in your packet, and also the drawings just 1 2 in case you wanted to refresh yourself with what they had 3 actually done, but we do recommend approval. 4 This is the rear of the property and some 5 interior shots, and that's it. They did a great job, and the owner is here 6 7 if you have any questions for her or just want to say yay, 8 so that's it. 9 MR. EHRENHAFT: Okay. MS. KAUTZ: We are looking for a motion. 10 This will be recommended to the city commission if you all 11 12 do approve it because they end up ultimately approving the 13 ad valorem, and then we send it to the county, and then it 14 works through their process for a gajillion years and then 15 they approve it, so. 16 MR. EHRENHAFT: Okay. Does anybody on the 17 board have any questions for staff regarding the matter, or to the applicant? 18 19 MR. FULLERTON: One little thing, the pictures at the end show the pecky cypress ceiling. 20 Are 21 those the original pecky cypress? 22 MS. GILHULY: Yes. 23 MR. FULLERTON: So you saved them. Great 24 job. I'll move it. 25 MR. EHRENHAFT: Is there a second?

Page 21 1 MR. GARCIA-PONS: I'll second it. 2 MR. CEBALLOS: This is a public hearing. 3 Anything the public wants to say? 4 MR. EHRENHAFT: Actually the public should MR. CEBALLOS: Close the public hearing. 5 MS. KAUTZ: You need to do that first. б 7 MR. EHRENHAFT: So okay, so I let it go to the board discussion before I asked the public. 8 MS. KAUTZ: That's okay. Does anyone in the 9 public wish to --10 MR. EHRENHAFT: So does anyone in the 11 12 audience wish to speak in favor of the item? Okay, okay. Then we'll close the period for public comment and return 13 14 to the board. So Mr. Fullerton, you had a motion? 15 MR. FULLERTON: Yes. I move staff 16 recommendation for approval. 17 MR. GARCIA-PONS: I'll second it. MR. EHRENHAFT: Okay. So Jessie, do you call 18 the roll then? 19 20 THE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT: Sure. 21 MR. EHRENHAFT: Okay.
