NEW BUSINESS:

University of Miami - NSU CARD - Ms. Silvia Gil

Ms. Gil addressed Board regarding initiative offered by University of Miami NSU CARD (power point – Exhibit 1) – Autism Friendly. Ms. Gil stated it provides assistance to entities which would like to

participate and achieve Autism Friendly certification. Ms. Gil advised it is a free service and has three distinct levels of certification.

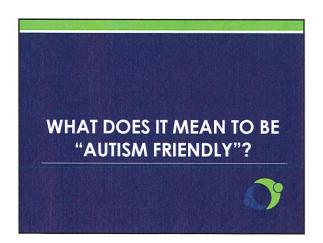

- Utilize visual supports, such as: social narratives, sensory guides, choice boards, task analysis
- Agree to receive additional support from CARD Staff based on community feedback

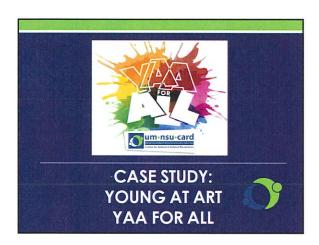


Role of UM-NSU CARD Staff

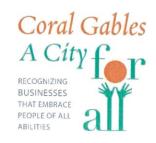
