Vice Mayor Quesada: Madam City Manager is there a presentation on this or explanation?

City Manager Swanson-Rivenbark: We briefed you all individually that we had done this for Hurricane Irma, because we pick up their trash, their recycling, their garbage, we move to pick up their landscape debris. We created an agreement after the fact and this time we are doing it in anticipation and I'm told by the City Attorney's Office there is no expiration date to this.

Assistant City Attorney Throckmorton: No. This is to allow the City Manager once the Mayor has declared a state of emergency, if there is widespread debris to go in and pick up debris in Tahiti Beach and Journeys End, just like we did with Irma, but this time we won't be doing it after the fact or rushing to do anything.

Mayor Valdes-Fauli: But, I still would have to sign the emergency.

Assistant City Attorney Throckmorton: Yes. This is contingent on the Mayor declaring a state of emergency.

Commissioner Lago: So moved.

Vice Mayor Quesada: Second.
