This vehicle will be a self-contained, third-tier for communication in any hazardous situation that the City may be confronting. So, as far as our portfolio of equipment that we have, this is kind of the final cog in the wheel, if you will, to have a total command presence with yourselves as well as the rest of the Police, Fire Department and Communications. So, we will be able to talk via satellite through phones and our telephone lines in the event of anything else that can confront this city. We -- again, this all came through FAF funds, so there was no tax dollars used in the purchase
